## Year's Project

As worthy a project as could be found is the 1948 undertaking of Chapter AU of PEO. The group has adopted a Polish orphan, Maria Przblyska, under the Foster Parents' Plan for War Children, Inc.

The chapter is divided into monthly committee of three, and each member writes a letter to be sent with a monthly package of food or clothing. Birthdays and holidays are also remembered with special packages. The chapter assumes an adoption cost of \$180 a year.

As for the personal history of Maria, she is 11 years old. She lived

in Wyszkow, Poland, when tragedy came and her father was killed by the Germans. Soon after, her mother died of grief and privation. Maria and her sister were left to care for themselves as best they could and were finally placed in a Warsaw orphanage. They now live in a children's home under care of the Foster Parents organization.

The plan has cared for more than 5200 children in eight countries with its aim to a further personal relationship between the child and foster parent, as well as to aid the child's rehabilitation.
