### House Passage Of Tax Cut Bill Seen By GOP Leaders

WASHINGTON, Jan. 26 (AP)—Republican leaders said today they expect to whip their \$6,300,000,000 tax-cutting bill to house passage with "substantial" democratic help and the loss of not more than three GOP votes.

### Witnesses To Jungle Site Shooting Questioned Today

Several witnesses to the Friday afternoon shooting of 45-year-old Robert Theodore Melias are being questioned today by District Attorney Clarence Humble and state police, and James Elza Wyatt, 31, is still booked at the county jail for murder. A formal charge probably will be placed against him today.

### Stastny Quits Water Post

MALIN, Jan. 26—After 28 years of continuous service as secretary of the Malin irrigation district, M. Stastny has submitted his resignation. Replacing Stastny will be Mark Evans, who has served on the board for three years and been president two years.

### Teacher Strike Looms In Chicago

CHICAGO, Jan. 26 (AP)—A teacher strike threat hung over the city council's finance committee in its scheduled meeting today on approval of a record \$97,972,000 public school tax levy for 1948.

### DeLap Seeks Re-Nomination

County Clerk Charles DeLap declared today for re-nomination by republicans for the office he now holds. DeLap has been clerk for one term of four years, but under his father, the late C. R. DeLap, he served as deputy clerk off and on for 20 years.

### Venison Leads To Jail Terms

### Oil Export Ban Asked

The third cold wave within a week moved into the north central part of the nation today as the death toll of the second, still gripping the South and East, reached 60.

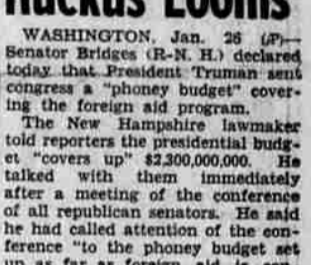
### 27 Killed In Sunday Disturbance
