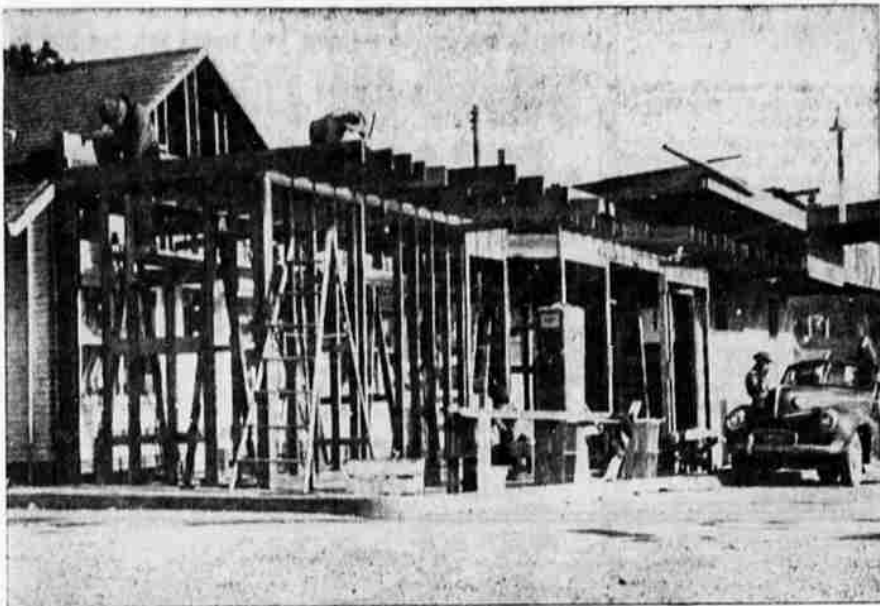


Activities In Chiloquin District

G. B. Shaw Is The Only Man Fit For Everlasting Life

NEW YORK, Jan. 28 (AP)—A genie is a big-muscled spook who steps out of a smoke cloud and says, "Did you call room service?" "He will then grant you any wish." Suppose one of these fugitives from Aladdin's lamp came to you some moonlit midnight and said: "I give you the power to confer eternal life on any one person in the world."

Who would you choose? I'd pick the greatest vegetarian of them all—George Bernard Shaw, the red-haired Irishman who began his career looking like a carrot and has been whittened by the years to the semblance of a stem lined cauliflower.

Why? Well, to begin with I wouldn't want it myself. The average man's yearning for earthly immortality wears out as his experience with the world increases, monkey glands and social security benefits notwithstanding.

For that reason I wouldn't wish it on Professor Einstein or some other great human landmark. Not unless I was sure he wanted it. Nor would I have the heart to inflict it as a curse on my worst enemy. Who's that mad at anybody?

The last great school books record as having been chosen eternal life wasn't Ponce de Leon, who failed to find the fountain of youth in Florida but did beat the first bookie there by ten minutes.

Aurora became so embarrassed by this elderly escort that she shut him up in a chamber and kept him in a cradle, where the poet says his voice "flowed on unceasingly."

The morn goddess finally got Tithonus changed into a grasshopper—amid the laughter of the gods. She would have met a man of tougher fiber had she picked on George Bernard Shaw, the meatless wonder of the literary world. Of course Shaw, one of the most moral men who ever lived, would have made the rosy goddess keep her distance, anyway.

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Trojan Winner
It was Trojans, a Trojan gigolo. Tithonus was the son of a king of Troy and the boy friend of Aurora, the goddess of dawn. She liked her playfellow so well she finally got daddy Zeus to make him immortal. But there was a gimmick—she forgot to ask eternal youth for him. So Tithonus kept on living but grew old and shriveled and crabbed.

Witty Reason
The voice of Shaw, like that of Tithonus, does flow on unceasingly. But there the resemblance ceases. The voice is witty, reasoned and forceful—still speaking the clearest King's English of any Irishman since Dean Swift.

Although Shaw is a self-professed physical coward, his life has been one of endless battles, most of which he ended himself—and he still has it's steak-eating or vivisection, both of which he's agin.

A barnum of the highbrows, no man ever praised himself harder and few ever lived up to their own estimate more. He didn't actually say he was a better dramatist than Shakespeare. He was more subtle—he just rewrote Shakespeare to show how he could be improved.

Puckish and elfin as ever, this acidulous Santa Claus, having outlived two generations of critics, is composing another drama in his ninety-second year and still finding time to engage in postcard debates on religion with American college students.

He is currently Broadway's highest paid dramatist. His "Man and Superman" revival is outdrawing that upstart Shakespeare's "Antony and Cleopatra" by \$7000 a week—and Shakespeare is being helped by Katharine Cornell.

Most of the \$4000 a week Shaw gets from capitalistic America goes to support the socialist austerity of Britain, but socialism is what he

The United States navy recruiting office is located in the post office building, in room 307, telephone 3431.

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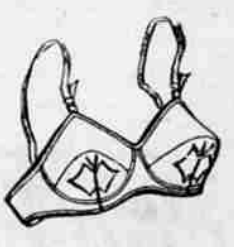
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Seven Held For Fraud

SPOKANE, Wash., Jan. 28 (AP)—Seven persons, one of them a former employe of Hanford, Wash., atomic energy project, were under arrest today on charges that they collected \$200,000 from investors with a scheme for recovering gold from black sand, U. S. Attorney Harvey Erickson reported.

A secret indictment returned by a federal grand jury here January 19 and made public yesterday, accused the seven of conspiracy, using the mails to defraud and violation of the securities act.

It charged that Dr. Harold R. Reitor of Richland, Wash., was described in the literature distributed by the group as "a key atomic scientist in the development of the atomic bomb at the Hanford project."

Actress May Get Second Trial

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 28 (AP)—Movie Actress Madge Meredith will remain in the Los Angeles county jail pending outcome of her appeal from her conviction in the kidnap-beating of her former manager.

She was about to be transferred to the state prison for women at Tehachapi yesterday when her lawyer filed notice of appeal and obtained a writ of probable cause staying the transfer.

The actress was sentenced last week to a term of five years to life for her part in the beating of Nicholas Gianelis, Hollywood restaurant supply man and her former manager.

ERICKSON said Reitor was a Richland chiropractor, and that while he worked on the Hanford project during the war, "his job was to test water before they put it in boilers to see that it would not corrode the pipes."

Others named in the indictment were F. E. Nemeo, Westcott H. Clarke and Bonewitz X. Dawson, arrested in Los Angeles; Stanley E. Richardson, Richland; Henry P. Schwartz, Seattle; and Flora L. Carpenter, Spokane.
