

Housing Row Boils Down Here

Austin Hayden, administrator of federal housing here, said today he was not backing down on his policies of handling the housing units and that he had never proposed tearing down any of the housing units so long as they are needed.

Hayden said he was under pressure from the higher-ups in the federal housing service to terminate units here, but would not favor that himself until it was clear the apartments or houses are excess or unlivable.

Agreement Reached
His statement was in answer to allegations recently made that he was suggesting that 15 Mountain View housing units, which are vacant, be torn down. Yesterday Hayden and Winston Purvine, OVS director, reached an agreement to let Oregon Vocational school students rent those apartments.

Hayden also denied he had ever shown any favoritism in renting apartments or granted "special privileges" to any tenants. He said occasionally something slipped through that wasn't exactly right, but he had no control over such happenings.

The Allied Veterans council earlier this week claimed to know of 14 instances of "special privileges," but the housing supervisor said he had heard of only two and in both cases the person complaining was wrong.

Hayden also declared he was not backing down on his policy concerning allowing OVS students to occupy federal apartments, that permanent resident veterans would be given first choice.

Ranch Home Burns To Ground

TULELAKE, Jan. 29.—The four-room frame house on the ranch of the late Mrs. Emma Kirby, burned to the ground Tuesday.

When the fire was discovered by L. C. Kirby, a son who lives on an adjacent ranch about four miles west of Tulelake at 4:30 p. m. it was too late to check it.

Fire was thought to have started from defective wiring, causing a \$4000 loss. The completely furnished house was covered by insurance.

Oregon City Man Awarded Medal

PITTSBURGH, Pa., Jan. 29 (AP)—The Carnegie Hero Fund commission has awarded one of 10 bronze medals for heroism to Ellis Pudwill, route 3, Oregon City.

The commission announced that Pudwill, 33, an electrician, saved Genevieve J. Kay, 22, from drowning in Fargo, N. D., on June 14, 1947, when she fell into the Red river while fishing.

The citation said that the Oregon man, although just previously hospitalized and still weakened from his illness, had swam fully clothed to where she disappeared in the swift current. He finally succeeded in reaching Mrs. Kay and towing her to near the river bank where others helped bring her ashore.
