

# Health Survey To Be Made

Dr. Sheldon Gray and Dr. Clara Storvick of Corvallis conferred yesterday and today with Dr. Beth M. Kerou, county health officer, on preliminary arrangements for a health survey to be conducted in Klamath county in April.

The U. S. public health service, the U. S. department of agriculture and the state agricultural experiment stations are cooperating in this program of studying human nutrition.

The first studies will be developed in Oregon in conjunction with the state board of health.

Dr. Gray with the U. S. Public Health Service at Oregon State College and Dr. Storvick, associate professor of nutrition at the college will be here for two or three weeks conducting the survey in April with a team of 10 including physicians, nurses, bacteriologists, dentists and nutritionists.

Subjects for the survey will be high school students 14, 15 and 16 years of age who volunteer for the tests and have the consent of their

parents. They must be natives of this area and have lived here continuously.

Liquor will include general and dietary histories, finger-drop blood tests, saliva tests, dental tests to determine the extent of caries and medical tests to determine any nutritional deficiency.

The water supply will be examined in relation to its effect on the human system.

Results of the survey will be available to participants, their parents and other interested groups.

## Theft Of Spuds Reported Here

State police have reported the theft of 15 sacks of number one Gold Tag brand potatoes from the Bob Cheyne potato cellar at Stukel siding, sometime Tuesday night.

## Old Wells Uncovered

Two old stone-walled wells recalling early history of Klamath Falls came to light through excavations made this week as part of the remodeling of Drew's Manstare.

Old timers dated the wells to approximately 1870, and believed people by the name of Wilson dug them.

Extending the basement of the building for a downstairs sales department by excavating the space by the distance of the sidewalk above, revealed the wells.

Remodeling includes moving the front of the store forward, extending the room back under the balcony which will also be changed. Finishing the walls in natural mahogany, the floors in oak planking and installing a horseshoe center glass island show case.

The center section of the store front outside will be taken out to make a 36-foot open lobby flanked by large glass windows. Oriental marble of a rosy hue will be used
