# Northern Areas Of Nation Chilled By Zero Weather

CHICAGO, Feb. 4 (AP)—Zero weather chilled the northern section of the country today from the Dakotas to northern New England as shortage of fuel supplies in some communities continued acute.

There appeared no relief for the frigid north central region where temperatures skidded to a low of 38 below. The mercury dipped past the 30 below mark in parts of Minnesota and Wisconsin today and to a

# Half Supply Of Electric Power Used

ed by the management to report at 8 p. m. today.

Lumber operations in Klamath Falls, Bly, Sprague River, Modoc Point, Alturas, Canby and Lakeview were affected by the reduced power supply.

A. S. Cummins, president of Copco, said today that an unprecedented demand for service, coupled with the drought in California, had made it necessary to ask some power users to adjust to off-peak hours.

He said:

"During this season of the year, we face two daily peaks, one from 8 to 11 in the morning, the other from 5 to 7 in the evening. These peaks are the cumulative effect of many customers calling for service at the same time. The highest demand ever recorded by this company was 155,000 kilowatts at 10 a. m. December 10, 1947.

"That meant at that particular time, no matter how short the duration was, we had to supply that amount of power. Because our own plant generating capacity was insufficient to meet such a demand, it was necessary for us to supplement our available supply with power purchased from PG&E under our exchange agreement with them.

**Irrigation Load**

"The critical water shortage now existing in California has not only seriously reduced that company's anticipated supply of power but has required it to take on a large irrigation pumping load not ordinarily served until late spring in each year. The result is PG&E finds itself forced to discontinue deliveries of power to us for the time being.

"We believe this condition is only a temporary one that will soon be relieved by seasonal rain. Should this not be the case, however, and should we in turn face a short water year our ability to adequately supply our customers may be severely taxed and require a general curtailment of service by all types of users."

# Tule Church Work Starts

TULELAKE, Feb. 4—Ground will be broken early next week for a new First Christian church, to be located on two lots on the east-west road facing the high school athletic field. The proposed construction which will give Tulelake a fourth church, was made known by Rev. Howard F. Hutchins, pastor of the First Christian church in Klamath Falls, after interested persons here requested a building permit in the amount of \$6000 at the city council session Monday night.

Interest in establishment of a church of this denomination here has been growing among both urban and rural districts for many months, culminating in application for the former Buddhist temple and fire station No. 2 at the former WRA center. Material from these two buildings will be the ground work for a completely modern, frame structure which will be placed on the rear of the lots to permit building a larger structure nearer the street at some future time.

The building will now have a small auditorium, study for the future pastor, several class rooms and rest rooms, all to be heated with thermo-electric units. New floors will be laid.

Construction costs will probably exceed the anticipated \$6000. The ground space, 220 by 110 feet was purchased from Charles K. Wiese.

# Bids Opened On Tule Dike Work

Bids were opened by the bureau of reclamation this morning, Tuesday, on improvement, enlarging and general dike work in the area south of Tulelake.

Three low bidders were Tyson and Watters company of Sacramento Calif., \$35,867.90; T. W. Thomas, Portland, \$37,519; J. A. and R. A. Cook of Inglewood, Calif., \$43,615, according to Office Engineer Mark Taylor.

In all eight bids were submitted. Awarding of the bid will be made through the USBR main office in Denver, Colo., on recommendation from the Klamath district.

# Death Verdict A Little Late

ROSEBURG, Ore., Feb. 4 (AP)—Ralph R. Mojonner, found dead of gunshot wounds in his home near Drains October 29, "old not count" suicide. Coroner Harry C. Stearns reported today following an inquest.

The verdict filed by the coroner's jury found that Mojonner "came to his death by gunshot wounds by a person or persons unknown to the jury."

The county grand jury, now in session, is investigating the case.

# Declining Log Production In Klamath Area Surveyed

PORTLAND, Feb. 4 (AP)—A report on declining log and lumber production in Klamath county was issued today by Dr. J. R. Hall, director of the Pacific Northwest forest and range experiment station.

The report said 1945 log production of 420,000,000 feet was only slightly more than half that of 1941. At that, the 1945 figure was about twice the calculated sustained yield capacity of the county's timber lands, the report said.

The first cutting cycle in sustained yield plans is estimated at less than 200,000,000 feet, although the total may be increased later, the report continued.

The volume of saw timber went down from 22.4 billion board feet

At the present time the telephone workers organizing committee consists of some 70,000 workers throughout the country. All telephone workers in all departments of the Klamath Falls area are urged to attend the meeting.

# Chico's Anguish Worth Ten Grand

LOS ANGELES, Feb. 4 (AP)—Comedian Chico Marx has been awarded \$10,000 damages for the "mental pain," humiliation and inconvenience he contends resulted from references to him in a movie, "Rhapsody in Blue."

A superior court jury made the award yesterday in Marx's \$200,000 invasion of privacy suit against Warner Brothers Pictures.

Marx claimed his name was used in the picture without permission and that the film gave the impression that he once played piano in a theatre in "a cheap neighborhood."

vinces as a symbol of universal love. Devadas, who lighted his father's funeral pyre last Saturday, said he and other relatives and friends would accompany the funeral urn to Allahabad in a special train leaving February 11.

The train will travel slowly to Allahabad, 350 miles southeast of here, he said, pausing frequently to allow the populace along the way a final look at the urn.

Upon arrival at Allahabad, the funeral procession—on foot—will accompany the urn directly to the confluence of the rivers. It is there that Gandhi's favorite deity—Rama—is said to have performed the same rite for his own father.

**Wade Into Stream**

One of the peacemaker's sons will wade into the sacred waters to set the bones adrift as he immerses himself. The ceremony, according to Hindu belief, washes away the sins and purifies the spirit of the departed one.

Devadas said the ashes of his father will be presented in individual containers to various representatives of Indian provinces for similar services. The bones and ashes were separated at a ceremony Monday.

The funeral urn now stands under military guard in the room where Gandhi died.

# Angell Declares He's A Candidate

PORTLAND, Feb. 4 (AP)—Rep. Homer D. Angell (R-Ore.) will be a candidate to succeed himself as congressional representative from Oregon's third district.

The republican notified friends here he would file for the primary election by March 12.

MADISON, Wis., Feb. 4 (AP)—Beer for cows? Certainly not. But a wee nip of something stronger for the male of the species isn't amiss even here in "America's dairyland."

Dairymen at the University of Wisconsin farm and home show pooh-poohed claims that a beer-drinking English cow produced 41,952 pounds of milk in 329 days, and declared they'd continue to feed alfalfa, silage and grain.

It's different, though, with bulls. "A couple of slugs of gin or bourbon will do wonders for a listless, sleep-eyed bull," one veteran cattleman commented. "But give 'em too much and you'd better run for the barn."
