

S.P. Instruction Car Here On Refresher Course Work

Southern Pacific's "instruction car," equipped with models, charts, motion picture projector, and manned by experts on railroad rules and operating procedures, has arrived in Klamath Falls to assist employees with refresher courses in railroad training. C. R. Rice, system examiner, is in charge of the railroad's "rolling classroom" which will be here throughout the week.

The special car tours the company's more than 8000 miles of western lines, and the instruction work carried on among employees is one of the major activities in the railroad's constant effort to achieve maximum safety in all its operations. Rice explained. Each employee concerned with train operation attends two classes at each visit to the instruction car, a total of 19,296 attending the daytime and evening sessions held last year.

Conference-type classes are conducted on a question-and-answer basis by Rice, a former chief train dispatcher, and his two assistants, F. H. Berger and L. B. Salting, both former conductors. Instruction and discussion place emphasis on train order rules and general rules governing safe and efficient operations.

A model, representing six miles of standard railroad, is an important factor in the visual education program. By means of its tracks, switches, sidings, crossings and an electrically operated block signal system, the instructors can work out and graphically answer any problem that occurs in handling trains. The car is parked at the depot here.

The railroad has operated a "rolling classroom" for more than 40 years, Rice having been with it the last 10 years. The present one is remodeled from an observation car. One half is used as living quarters for the three instructors, the other half being devoted to the class room.

Quite a number of changes on the Shasta division have been reported here. Walter C. Hughes, for the past four years trainmaster located at Klamath Falls, takes off today, Thursday, to assume his duties as trainmaster at San Luis Obispo, Calif. Hughes is being replaced here by Harvey Teal of Niland, Calif. Teal, incidentally, will not only take over Hughes' desk but will also move into Hughes' apartment at 513 Eldorado.

It all started when Claire Phelps, trainmaster at Watsonville Junction, was moved to Portland, a fellow named Robey transferred from San Luis Obispo, to Watsonville Junction, and Hughes replaces Robey. Walker B. Knotts, assistant train-

master at Alturas, has been promoted to trainmaster at Niland, replacing Teal, and a man by the name of Knight up at Crescent Lake has been moved to Alturas to take over Knotts' old job. Hope this is straight.

Another change of interest to railroad men here is the promotion of B. S. Sines, superintendent of the Salt Lake division at Ogden, Utah, who has been appointed special representative of the president, A. T. Mercier. J. R. Kaillbough has been named to Sines' post on the Salt Lake division.

F. V. Percival, superintendent of Great Northern's Klamath division, returned Wednesday from Chicago where he has been for the past several weeks on business.

C. E. Marston, traveling car service agent from Seattle, is here visiting the GN offices.

LAKE SUCCESS, Feb. 5 (AP)—Russia was reported today to have informed the United Nations that Soviet economic production is back to pre-war levels.

This information was contained in a report of the Soviet state planning commission which was handed to the UN secretary by Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko.

The report previously had been published in Moscow.

The Soviet data arrived too late for inclusion in the UN's first big

survey on world economic conditions issued last night.

While the Soviet report contained no information not already published, UN officials said this was the first time Russia had supplied the UN with production data of any kind.
