ICC May Rule Shipping Rate

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5 (AP)—The interstate commerce commission may take over the regulation of most shipping rates between mainland United States and Hawaii and Alaska if the territories become states.

At present, the maritime commission controls sea commerce between the United States and the two territories.

But the interstate commerce act delegates to the interstate commerce commission the duty of regulating the rates charged by water carriers, with certain exceptions, operating "between a point in a state and a point in any other state."

Therefore, officials of both the maritime commission and the interstate commerce commission told a reporter, unless congress amends the interstate commerce act simultaneously with the admission of Hawaii or Alaska as a state the interstate commerce commission probably would assume jurisdiction automatically over the bulk of shipping between the mainland and the new off-shore state.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5 (AP)—The government of Nicaragua is holding two planes which, the Nicaraguan ambassador to Washington says, arrived there recently "with Venezuelan crew members hostile to the Venezuelan government."

The FBI, meanwhile, was looking into the disappearance of two bombers from this country, after Venezuela had said they probably were mixed up in a plot to bomb Caracas, her capital city.

The announcement that two planes are under guard at Puerto Cabezas, where they landed, was made here yesterday by Nicaraguan Ambassador Guillermo Sevilla Sacasa.
