**Italy Cracks Down On Alien Activity**  
ROME, Feb. 5 (AP)—Italy's government, facing a crucial national election this spring, cracked down on activities of aliens today while the cabinet debated strict anti-communist measures.

Premier Alcide de Gasperi's middle-of-the-road cabinet decreed

prison terms and fines for "all those who give shelter or employment to aliens or persons without citizenship status." The decree called for double the usual penalties up to June 30.
