

Skirts Go Down Again

PARIS, Feb. 11 (AP)—Paquin and Bruyere, two veteran Paris fashion houses had but one major point in common in their spring collections today.

They both dropped hemlines to less than 10 inches from the ground. Bruyere dipped to seven inches for some afternoon gowns and top coats. Paquin was more moderate in this respect but went all out in achieving well upholstered hips and hour glass waists.

Bruyere rejected all artificial aids and placed her faith in a cutting technique which creates a natural if subdued figure-eight line.

Split Skirts

Paquin showed many leg-restricting skirts that were split up the back or front as far as the knee. The designer also exhibited full skirted numbers.

Bruyere used skirt fullness derived from panels or flares. She displayed several gowns with fullness falling from the waist in pleats which were nailed into a tight band around the knee.

Paquin showed a top coat of pillar box red which resembled an academic gown. Bruyere showed something very similar in black taffeta. Bruyere used some colors of green, deep plum and beige. Paquin chose more lively shades of lime, butter yellow and smoke blue.

\$6 Billion In U. S. Currency Hoarded

NEW YORK, Feb. 11 (AP)—Rep. Frank L. Sundstrom (R-N.J.) believes that between \$6,000,000,000 and \$8,000,000,000 of a total of \$28,120,000,000 of United States currency in circulation has been hoarded, lost or destroyed.

He made the estimate during a news conference to explain his proposal to exchange outstanding American currency for brand new bills.

Chief objective of the measure he introduced in congress recently, he said, is to make an accurate inventory of outstanding United States money.
