

UO Singers Slated Here

Music lovers here are looking forward to the appearance of the University of Oregon Singers, scheduled for 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, February 22, in the KUHS auditorium. The concert is presented under the auspices of the University of Oregon Alumni association and the music department of KUHS.

Donald W. Allton, assistant professor of organ and theory of music in the University of Oregon and director of the university singers, a small chorus of 40 voices selected from the university's choral union, has had more than 15 years' experience in directing choral groups. Allton began his teaching career with a two-year teaching fellowship in theory in the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, N. Y., in 1936. Following a four-year stay at the University of Kentucky as instructor of theory and glee club from 1938 to 1942, he went to Mary Baldwin college in Staunton, Va., serving as acting head of the music department from 1942 until his appointment to the University of Oregon in 1944 as an assistant professor of organ and theory of music.

A member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, men's national music fraternity; patron of Phi Beta, women's national music honorary; and the American guild of organists, Allton received his bachelor of music in 1936, and his master of music degree in 1938 from the Eastman School of Music.

Gleeson Is Alaska Bishop

SEATTLE, Feb. 11 (AP)—The most Rev. Francis Doyle Gleeson, S. J., superior of the Jesuit Omak Indian mission, Omak, Wash., will be bishop of Alaska.

Word of his appointment by Pope Pius XII was received by the Rev. Harold O. Small, rector of Seattle college, from Archbishop Amleto Cicognani, apostolic delegate to the United States.

Bishop Gleeson attended St. Joseph's grade school and Marquette high school in Yakima, and entered the Jesuit order in 1912. He studied philosophy at Mount St. Michael's Scholasticate, Spokane, from 1917 to 1920.

He was stationed at Port Townsend for ascetical theology during 1927 and 1928. It was in the latter year that he became a teacher at Tacoma's Ballarmino high school where he was president from 1933 until 1939.

He served as rector of the Jesuit Novitiate at Eberhard, Ore., from 1939 until 1942. He has been at his present post since 1946.

Navy Ships To Go To Cuba

WASHINGTON, Feb. 11 (AP)—The navy is sending a destroyer and three submarines to Cuba next week for the 50th anniversary observance of the sinking of the battleship Maine.

The vessels will arrive in Havana from Key West, Fla., on February 13 and remain three days. They are the destroyer Sarsfield and the submarines Spikfish, Sablefish and Madregal.

The battleship Maine was blown up in Havana harbor February 15, 1898, shortly before the outbreak of the Spanish-American war. Cause of the blast, which took 260 lives, was never determined.

Hungary-Russian Pact In Offing

BUDAPEST, Hungary, Feb. 11 (AP)—Reports circulated here today that a Hungarian delegation headed by Premier Lajos Dinnyes will leave Thursday or Friday for Moscow to sign a treaty of friendship and mutual assistance.

There was no official confirmation. The reports said Deputy Premier Matyas Rakosi and Arpad Szakasits and Foreign Minister Eric Molnar would be members of the delegation.

Hungary already has signed mutual aid and friendship treaties with Romania and Yugoslavia. Romania signed a similar treaty with Russia in Moscow last week.

Arab Death Squads Train

CAIRO, Egypt, Feb. 11 (AP)—Jamal Effendi Hussein, deputy chairman of the Palestine higher executive, said Tuesday Arab suicide squads are training in Palestine "for attacking the United Nations commission when it comes to the holy land."

Hussein made the statement in an interview. "This is a warning, not a threat," he said. "We shall not be able to take any responsibility concerning the security of the United Nations commission in Palestine."

Hussein, nephew of the exiled mufti of Jerusalem, is attending meetings of the Arab league here. He declared Arabs "will fight to the end" any force sent to Palestine to implement partition of Palestine. "Be it American or Russian." The United Nations voted to partition Palestine November 29.
