Driver Hurt In Accident

Robert Dunkley, 25, an employee of the Luther Huskins ranch in the Winema district, was seriously injured early yesterday afternoon when the 1941 pickup which he was driving collided with a heavy dump truck, driven by John Roy DeBuhr, at an intersection on the East-West road, four miles west of Tulelake.

California state police said the eastbound 1941 Dodge dump-truck, carrying three yards of gravel, had the right of way when the accident occurred. Both machines were demolished, but DeBuhr escaped without injury.

Dunkley was taken to Dr. Buford Hargus in Tulelake, and was taken from there to Hillside hospital in Klamath Falls by the Tulelake ambulance. The extent of his injuries was not immediately determined, but hospital attendants reported he was resting comfortably. He suffered a painful back injury.
