

Third Party Split Seen

CLEVELAND, Feb. 12 (AP)—A third party this year would "split and divide" labor and result in election of a "reactionary congress," declares CIO President Philip Murray.

"I don't know of a single solitary thing that it (a third party) can do except split and divide labor," Murray told the 13th national convention of the CIO-Industrial Union of Marine and Shipbuilding Workers yesterday.

"The mere fact of the proposition of the third party, if it is propagated in the United States in 1948, will be to create confusion among very conscientious men and weaken the movement. I do not favor the idea that we will form a third party in 1948 which will then face an inevitable defeat."

FDR, Jr., Raps Taft Objectives

CLEVELAND, Feb. 12 (AP)—Franklin D. Roosevelt Jr. said Wednesday that Senator Robert A. Taft (R-Ohio) "in his new isolationism of too little, too late," is on the same side as the Kremlin.

"The Russians do not want to see a free Western Europe," the son of the late president told the CIO-Industrial Union of Marine and Shipbuilding Workers yesterday.

"Taft opposes the Marshall plan because he is a Victorian, living in a bygone era. It is significant that he uses in his speeches the words 'return, go back.'"

"These are the words of big business, special interest groups."

Mrs. Broadhurst Slates New Appeal

SALEM, Feb. 12 (AP)—Attorneys for Mrs. Gladys Broadhurst, serving life for complicity in the slaying of her husband, have asked the supreme court to extend to April 10 the deadline for filing a brief in her appeal from the Malheur county conviction.

Court Clerk Arthur Benson reported state attorneys have agreed to the extension and that Chief Justice George Rossmann probably will act in a few days.

Mrs. Broadhurst was convicted of complicity in the murder of W. D. Broadhurst, Alvin Lee Williams, young ranch hand, testified at the trial that he killed Broadhurst at Mrs. Broadhurst's urging. He is serving a life term.

New Pension Plan Proposed For Army

WASHINGTON, Feb. 12 (AP)—Secretary of Defense Forrestal says the rules covering disability retirement should treat officers and enlisted men alike.

So he proposes that congress order a new examination of all officers retired for ailments since 1939. The actual percentage of physical disability would be fixed and their pay set accordingly.

This is the basis on which disabled enlisted men are paid now. Officers, however, receive 75 per cent of the pay for the rank at which they retire for disability. The income is tax free.

Forrestal made his proposal in a letter yesterday to Rep. Elston (R-Ohio), chairman of a house armed service subcommittee investigating the system.
