Big Jobs Up Permit Figure

Two big construction jobs lifted building out of its winter doldrums last week. In building permits okayed by the city council Monday night, permits tallied \$24,185. One of the two top jobs was for construction of a service station by W. D. Miller at S. 6th and Washburn way for \$12,000.

The other is for construction of a storage and sales building by Pinniger and Watkins at 1423 S. 6th for \$10,000. The building will house additional storage rooms and salesrooms for the People's Warehouse. The company's present headquarters will still be used, just across the street from the site of the new building.

Skidding Tree Kills Logger

TILLAMOOK, Feb. 17 (AP)—Lawrence Thornton Potter, 45, McMinnville, died yesterday in a hospital here of injuries received when a felled tree skidded downhill and carried him into a canyon.

Potter and David Curtis, Tillamook, were bucking logs on a hillside last Friday when a falling crew was working above them. The felled tree dropped properly, but started sliding on the snow and swept both men down the mountain.

Fourteen men worked for hours to extricate the injured loggers from beneath the tree. Curtis is expected to recover.

Potter is survived by his widow.
