

Jenkins Is Speaker At 20-30 Meet

At the 20-30 meeting Tuesday night, Frank Jenkins, publisher of The Herald and News, spoke on "The Future of Youth" and the Klamath basin.

Life in the United States is pride in our home towns, according to Jenkins, and being willing to fight for the rights of our respective homes. The youths of today must make provisions for running the government and organizations of the city, county and state after the present leaders have given up their place in the sun, and must be ready for their destiny. The future of the Klamath basin is assured due to the creating of a market for our produce being developed in Southern California. The crops of the basin have grown from a trickle of 4 million dollars in 1934 to more than 30 million dollars in 1947, Jenkins pointed out.

The timber resources are continuing to hold, he said, with the record of approximately 840 million feet of timber cut in 1943 to 410 million feet cut in 1947.

According to Jenkins, the lumber industry, in cutting the 410 million feet in 1947 used more than twice the man hours in producing this amount than in 1943 when the cut was more than twice that. The lumber industry is growing more and more, processing timber into finished products where it is produced more than ever before.

LONDON, Feb. 18 (AP)—Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip escaped unscathed today when their limousine and a taxi bumped near Buckingham palace.

River Searched For Lost Pilot

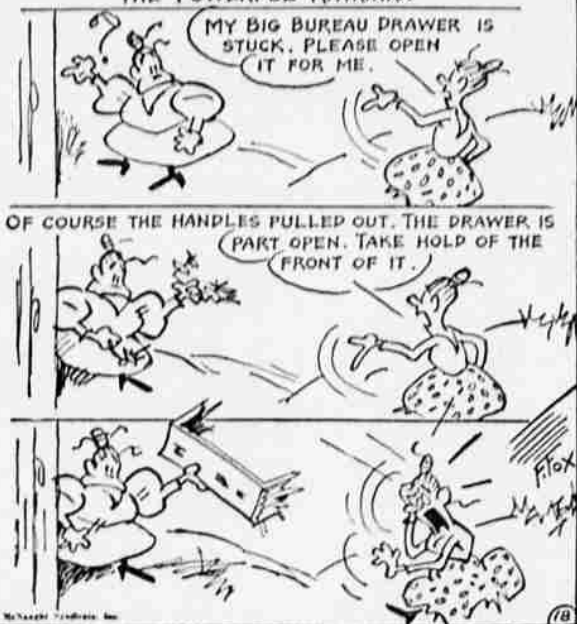
BONNEVILLE, Ore., Feb. 18 (AP)—River drugging by army engineers and sheriff's officers was planned today near the Bridge of the Gods above Bonneville dam in the search for missing pilot Guy Holliday, Richland, Wash.

Carl W. Nelson, search coordinator for the state board of aeronautics, reported an oil slick which persisted at the site was the only remaining clue in the disappearance of the young pilot.

Holliday failed to arrive as scheduled at Oregon City, February 7. He was flying from Kennewick in a rented airplane.

UN May Get Falklands Row

LONDON, Feb. 18 (AP)—A high government source said today a three-nation dispute over the Falkland Islands may be turned over to the United Nations.

The informant said, however, that Britain would prefer to see the claim settled privately.

It was not disclosed who would submit the dispute to the UN.

One government official discounted speculation that the dispute over the islands, off the South Argentine coast, would lead to a rift in relations between the claimants, Britain, Argentina and Chile.

He said, however, that Britain had no intention of relinquishing its "perfectly good" claim.

The informant said Britain's answer to a recent Argentine note, seeking an international conference on the claims, would reaffirm her position that the issue should be settled through the international court at The Hague.

Plane Schedule May Be Upped

SEATTLE, Feb. 18 (AP)—West Coast Airlines service between Seattle and Port Angeles will be stepped up "several" flights daily if Puget Sound ferries cease to operate, it was announced today by H. A. Munter, executive vice president of the company.

The line, which serves Western Washington and Oregon cities, now operates two flights daily to Port Angeles. The number of flights to

be added will depend upon public need, Munter said. The company, however, is not certificated to serve other cities which would be affected in event of a ferry shutdown.

The Puget Sound Navigation company has notified Governor Wallgren that it will abandon ferry operations at midnight February 29 unless the state leases its system and takes over for a year. The state plans to resist such a move through legal action.

Race For Uranium On

LONDON, Feb. 18 (AP)—There were reports in London today that uranium deposits might be the prize sparking the current dispute over possession of the bleak Falkland Islands, far down in the South Atlantic.

The London News Chronicle, without disclosing its sources of information, said in a front page story: "Uranium in the Falkland Islands is believed to be one of the reasons for Argentine and Chilean challenges to British sovereignty."

Uranium is basic mineral used in the production of atomic energy.

Britain announced yesterday that her South Atlantic flagship, Nigeria, is steaming toward the Falklands to "show the flag" in what the government considers British territory.

The 8000-ton cruiser left Simonstown, South Africa, yesterday under emergency orders.

Britain has promised full support to Governor Miles Clifford against Chilean and Argentine claims to the strategic islands, which lie northeast of Cape Horn, about 300 miles east of Argentina.

An Argentine task force left Friday for maneuvers in the Antarctic. Two Argentine cruisers and six destroyers are en route to Deception Island, where both Argentina and Britain have weather stations.

Gas Pipeline To Be Talked

SALEM, Feb. 18 (AP)—Public utilities officials of Washington, Idaho and Oregon will request the federal power commission to hold joint hearings in the proposed construction of a gas pipeline from Alberta, Canada, into the Northwest states.

The announcement was made today by Oregon Public Utilities Commissioner George H. Flagg, who said the federal power commission advised him and other Northwest utilities officials that the Northwest Natural Gas association has filed application for a permit to build the gas line.

The 24-inch natural gas line would enter the United States at Kingsgate, Idaho, and go to Seattle by way of Walla Walla, Spokane and Portland, Flagg said. This line would be 696 miles long.

A 150-mile 18-inch line would go from Vancouver, B. C., to Seattle, while there would be various lateral lines.

Flagg said the United States portion of the line would cost \$41,931,000, and the Canadian section \$36,568,000.

Oil Shortage Hits Incubators

WASHINGTON, Feb. 18 (AP)—This year's incubator chicks have reason to wish for the old-fashioned sitting hen.

The agriculture department reported today that the modern, mechanical "mothers" aren't doing so well. The fuel oil shortage, you know.

That, coupled with a drop in demand, caused commercial chick output in January to drop nine per cent below that of January, 1947, the department said.

RCAF Relays News To Snowbound Area

VANCOUVER, B. C., Feb. 18 (AP) Radio teletypes of the Royal Canadian air force were pressed into service yesterday to bring newspapers of this area their world news.

Heavy snows snapped lines of the regular Canadian Press teletype circuit, isolating the area. The Canadian air force relayed the news dispatches by radio from Edmonton to Vancouver.
