KLAMATH FALLS AND VICINITY: Fair tonight and Thursday. High today 48. Low tonight 30. High Thursday 40.

NORTHERN CALIFORNIA: Cloudy with occasional light rain from Salinas and Modesto and northwesterly today and scattered showers spreading farther south today and tonight, but clearing north portion tonight. Fair Thursday. Cooler northern section today and tonight and southern section Thursday. Moderate southwest wind off coast, becoming moderate to fresh northwest Thursday afternoon and tonight.

WESTERN OREGON: Fairly cloudy north and mostly cloudy south portion today, clearing conditions tonight. Partly cloudy Thursday. Much cooler temperatures 40 to 48 today and 38 to 45 Thursday. Low tonight 40 to 45 on coast and 25 to 35 inland valleys. Fresh to occasionally strong west to northwest wind off coast, decreasing tonight.

EASTERN OREGON: Mostly cloudy with showers today, clearing conditions tonight. Partly cloudy Thursday. Much cooler temperatures 35 to 45 today and 30 to 40 Thursday. Low tonight 25 to 35. Fresh to strong wind, decreasing tonight.
