

Irishmen Launch New Government

DUBLIN, Feb. 19 (AP)—Eire began its first experiment in coalition government today, and to most Irishmen that simply meant: "Dev" is out.

But while Eamonn de Valera, prime minister since 1932, has been turned out by the dail (parliament) he remains a political power in Eire. His fiancée fall (soldiers of destiny) party holds 68 parliament seats, only six short of a majority.

De Valera followers, far from downcast, were predicting the overthrow of the coalition and new elections within the year.

A five-party coalition, apparently resentful at De Valera's 16 years in office, joined forces yesterday and elected John A. Costello, 56, a Dublin attorney.

Costello said his policy "will be a national rather than a party one." "Our first concern will be directed to agriculture in our effort to increase production and raise the standard of living of the rural community," he said.

"I believe also that the new government will develop the friendliest relations with Britain and the British people and will do everything possible to increase trade between the two nations."

The idea of an Irish government without the mystical, New York-born De Valera, was still a little strange for many Irishmen.

Best Seller Criticized

NEW YORK, Feb. 19 (AP)—A Fordham university professor calls the best-selling novel "Raintree County," winner of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer's \$125,000 novel prize, "1086 pages of rank obscenity, blasphemy and sacrilege."

The Rev. Alfred Barrett, the Fordham professor also charged Book-of-the-Month club judges who chose the Ross Lockridge Jr. novel as their January selection with failure to keep faith with the public by praising the book "without qualification" in advance notices.

"No reviewer has, so far as I know,

called attention to the extremely objectionable attack against Christianity and Christ on page 1026 and thereabouts," Father Barrett said in an address last night.

"The resurrection, the virginity of Mary, the divinity of Jesus Christ himself are derided in terms of lascivious and unquotable blasphemy."

"Replete with sexual allegory, the book is curiously unaware of love."

EUGENE, Feb. 19 (AP)—AFL carpenters reported today the Dorena Construction company has agreed to the union's demand of \$2 an hour minimum wage.

A. R. Major, union business agent, predicted the agreement by the company, which holds a contract for work at the Dorena dam site near Cottage Grove, would mean an early end to the work stoppage of carpenters in this area.

Carpenters here walked off their jobs January 19 and estimates of the number idle have varied, some as high as 1000 at various times during the dispute.

1/4 cup drippings
1/4 cup finely chopped green pepper
1/4 cup finely chopped onion

Build up a fluted edge and prick top and sides of shell liberally with a fork to allow steam top and beneath crust to escape during baking. Bake in a preheated oven, 425°, for 15 minutes.
