COFFEE CAKE

Soften yeast in milk; cooled to lukewarm.

Let rise until double in size, about 2 hours. Stir batter and fill into greased 2-inch deep pan to about three-quarters full. Sprinkle with topping; degrease F. for about 20 to 25 minutes.
