Tulalake Home Makes Use Of Many New Processes

A home destined for gracious living is this three-bath, three-bedroom 1948 dwelling almost completed on the highway just this side of Tulalake.
The kitchen and breakfast room are combined and the living-dining room and entrance hall are all one long spacious room with a huge brick fireplace extending across one end and the two outside walls almost entirely glass windows.
There is a rumpus room, a two-car garage and a shop room, besides a concrete-floored outdoor living room. The interior walls are finished in canvas over sheetrock with a goodly portion of the main room in natural birch paneling. The rumpus room and boy's bedroom are finished in knotty pine.
Concrete floors are laid throughout the house which has no basement. The floors are entirely carpeted with the exception of baths and rumpus room.
Bedrooms have large clothes presses with sliding doors and closed shoe shelves below. The closets are cedar lined. In the master bedroom the bed and chests of drawers are built-in.
The rear of the house extends with wings on either side of the main room enclosing the outdoor living room and the garage juts forward from the front of the house. The exterior is finished in rough-sawn siding with oil stain.
Sheldon Brumbaugh is the architect.
