

## Long Back In Power In Louisiana

NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 25 (AP)—The Longs have been recalled to power in Louisiana.

Earl Long, brother of the late Sen. Huey P. Long, received a top-heavy vote over Sam Houston Jones in yesterday's democratic runoff primary election for governor.

An unofficial count of ballots cast in 1905 of the state's 1878 precincts gave Long 239,198 votes to 135,538 for Jones.

The nomination assures Long's election in this traditional democratic stronghold of the deep South. Republicans, who claimed only about 5000 registered voters in Louisiana's last general election two years ago, have not yet decided whether they will even bother to put up a candidate.

### Strong Comeback

Yesterday's vote was a strong comeback for the Long family. Huey's widow said that if Huey himself were here "he would be proud of this great victory for the people of the state."

Eight years ago, in 1940, Jones defeated Earl in the race for the governorship and brought to an end the regime set up by Huey Long 12 years before.

The new Long regime, Earl indicated today, will seek to outdo the previous one in action but probably not in showmanship.

"We'll improve on everything Huey did," Earl declared, sitting in his home with a few friends receiving election returns.

"The roads he built were good roads for their day—but now our roads must carry five times the traffic."

His "number one project," he said, will be raising old-age pensions to \$50 a month.

The new governor will have a new house of representatives to work with and perhaps a new senate. More than half of the 100 house seats and at least 17 of the 39 senate places went to newcomers.

### BONDS DEFEATED

SALEM, Feb. 25 (AP)—A proposed \$3,500,000 city school district bond issue was defeated decisively in yesterday's special election.

Voters rejected the issue, 3220 to 748 in the four districts. It was a record ballot for a local special school election.

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## Seattle Mayor Race Fight On

SEATTLE, Feb. 25 (AP)—Mayor William F. Devin and Allan Pomeroy, former U. S. district attorney, will battle it out during the next two weeks for the city's first four-year mayoral term.

The two candidates led a field of seven by a wide margin in yesterday's primary balloting. Devin, now completing his third two-year term, polled 32,153 votes with Pomeroy second with 29,036.

C. A. (Bill) Finger, Seattle shipman, ran third with 15,873. M. G. Tennent, former mayor of Tacoma, was fifth at 18,599.

Six councilmanic incumbents seeking re-election led a field of 29

candidates. Twelve were nominated. The finals will be held March 9.

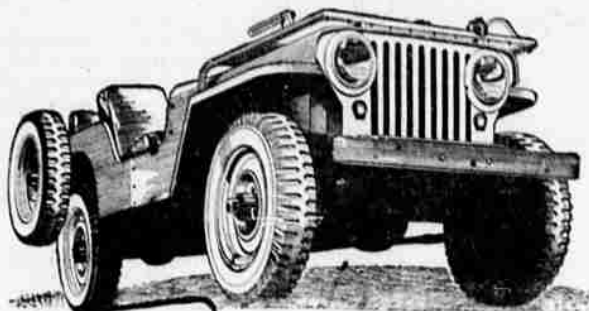

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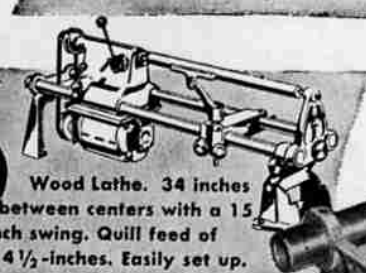
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
