

Special Trains Set For May Convention

Two special trains to bring delegates to Portland for the annual convention to be held in May have been arranged by the General Federation of Women's clubs at its headquarters in Washington, D. C. Both trains will take a full week both coming and returning in order to allow time for sightseeing trips planned en route. Two-day stopovers are included at both Los Angeles and San Francisco.

One train will go from New England to Chicago. The special will leave Chicago May 18 and come west through Banff and Lake Louise in the Canadian Rockies and through Vancouver and Seattle, arriving in Portland Sunday, May 23.

Following the convention it will return by way of Salt Lake City, Colorado Springs and St. Louis, leaving Portland Sunday, May 30.

The second convention special will come the northern route from Chicago, through Grand Canyon, Los Angeles and San Francisco, arriving in Portland Sunday, May 23. On its return it will go north through Seattle, Victoria, the Canadian Rockies and Kansas City.

Inventor Of Gregg Shorthand Dies

NEW YORK, Feb. 25 (AP)—John Robert Gregg, 80-year-old inventor of the shorthand system that bears his name, died Monday. He was

a former president of the National Arts club.

A native of Rockport, Northern Ireland, Gregg began experimenting with "speed writing" systems at the age of 10. In time he composed a shorthand alphabet of his own which subsequently was adapted to 13 languages.

Recently developed is a new method of impregnating paper with methylol urea, a thermoplastic resin, which prevents shrinking, swelling and warping.

Wedding Guest Hit By Press

BERLIN, Feb. 25 (AP)—Several German newspapers sharply criticized the presence of Adm. Nicholas Horthy, former regent of Hungary, as guest at an American wedding in Bavaria Sunday.

Horthy was invited to the wedding of Miss Wilhelmina Busch, 64-year-old heiress to a St. Louis, Mo., beer fortune, and Sam Woods, American consul in Munich.

Other guests included Prince Albrecht, oldest son of the pretender to the vanished Bavarian throne; Prince Rupprecht, and Murray D. Van Wagoner, director of the American office of military government for Bavaria. Van Wagoner is a former governor of Michigan.

The communist newspaper Neues Deutschland, noting the joint presence of Van Wagoner with the "fascist" Horthy, sarcastically captioned its article "the new coalition."

The British-licensed newspaper Telegraph said the presence of Horthy at such an affair indicated that "reaction in Bavaria again is becoming bold."

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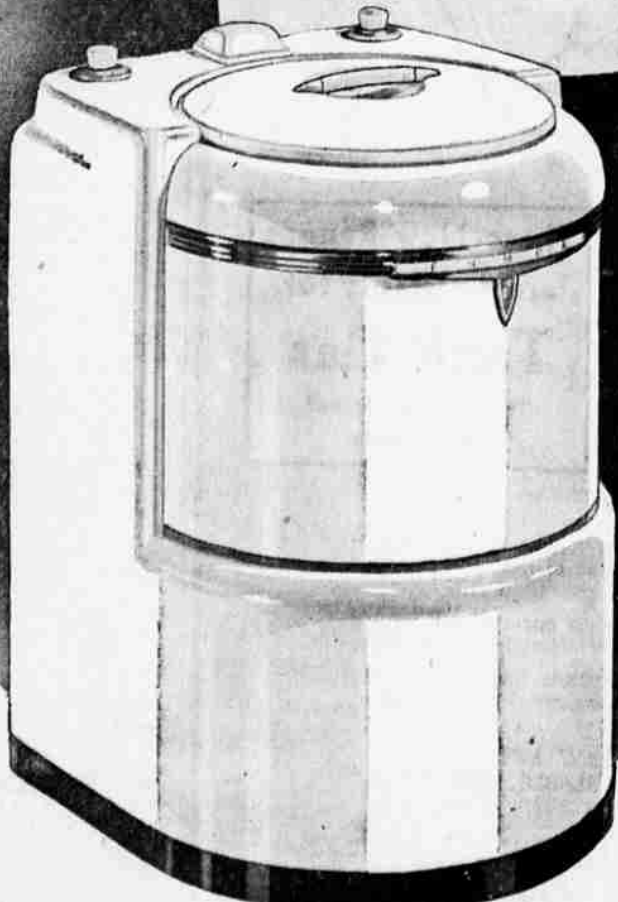
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
