

Educator Blasts System

ATLANTIC CITY, Feb. 25 (AP)—Almost 6,000,000 American children have been "cheated" of their educational birthright, Oscar R. Ewing said Tuesday.

The federal security administrator told a conference of school administrators the situation demands prompt and expanded federal aid to remedy it.

At the same time Ewing urged an end to the South's dual system of white and negro schools to ease the economic burden.

These were the major points he made in an address prepared for the American Association of School Administrators.

Ewing noted that in October, 1945, there were 39,500,000 children in the United States, ranging from ages 6 to 19. But he said only 24,500,000 were enrolled in school.

The basic cause, he said, is lack of money by parents, communities and states.

To overcome that, he said, the president's budget message to congress includes \$300,000,000 for educational aid.

Killer Found By Plane

FT. BENTON, Mont., Feb. 25 (AP)—County authorities Tuesday gave credit to the pilot of a search plane for the surrender of an armed fugitive.

Choteau County Undersheriff Claude Morris said James McVay, about 34, "got scared out when a plane buzzed the sheep camp where he hid."

McVay, object of a day-long search by a sheriff's posse, was jailed here in connection with the gunshot slaying of a Northern Montana rancher Sunday night.

Glen Hollandsworth about 40, was shot to death at his ranch home east of Conrad in North Central Montana. The killer wounded Hollandsworth's 11-year-old son, Harvey, and fled after struggling with the child's mother.

At an inquest early today, witnesses identified McVay as the slayer. He had worked on the Hollandsworth ranch.

Slot Theft Case Out Of Court

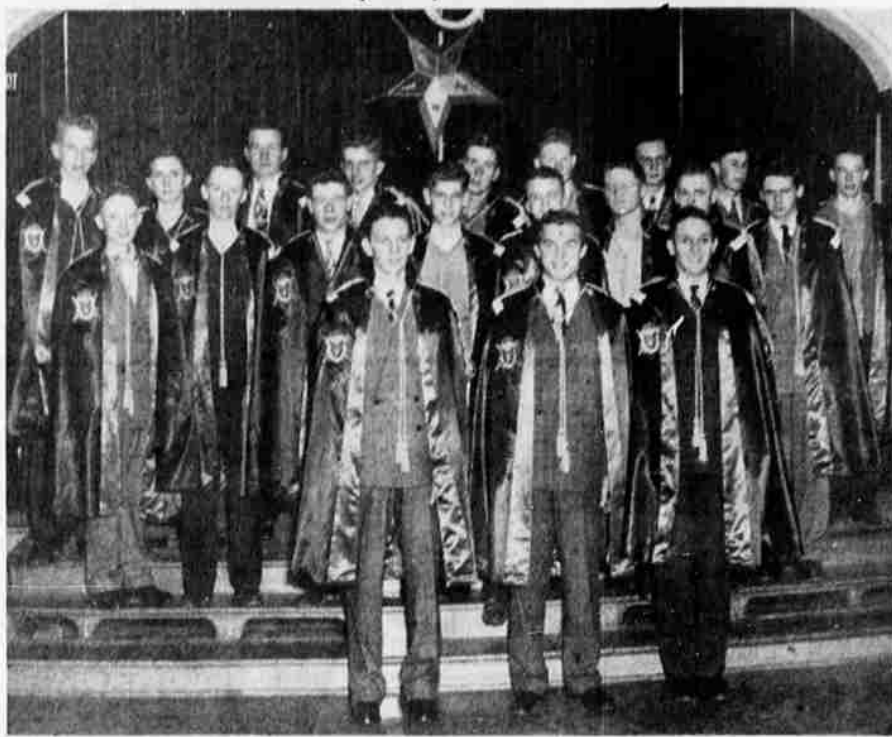
CHICAGO, Feb. 25 (AP)—Delbert Shinn, 36, the man who says he won't take "no" from a slot machine, was freed in municipal court Tuesday.

Detective Timothy O'Connell said Shinn talked freely of having drilled holes into many an Ohio slot machine and tripped the jack-pot lever with a wire, thus realizing a handsome return.

"But," the detective said Shinn claimed, "there's nothing illegal in that, because slot machines are illegal."

Judge Matthew D. Hartigan before whom Shinn appeared on a disorderly conduct charge dismissed the complaint.

Hospital Fund To Be Upped

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP)—The house appropriations committee Tuesday recommended an extra \$120,883,942 for aid to states on hospital construction, vocational education and relief work.

The money adds to funds previously appropriated for similar purposes.

It is for use during the remainder of the fiscal year ending June 30.

The new funds are part of a \$131,015,385 deficiency supply bill giving various agencies more money to tide them over the year.

Items include: agriculture department, \$6,966,200, including \$4,932,000 for fighting forest fires; commerce department, \$152,000 for arctic coast surveys in Alaska by the coast and geodetic survey.

The child was found by his mother, who took him from the water about 10 a. m. He had wandered from his home and apparently slipped into the water.

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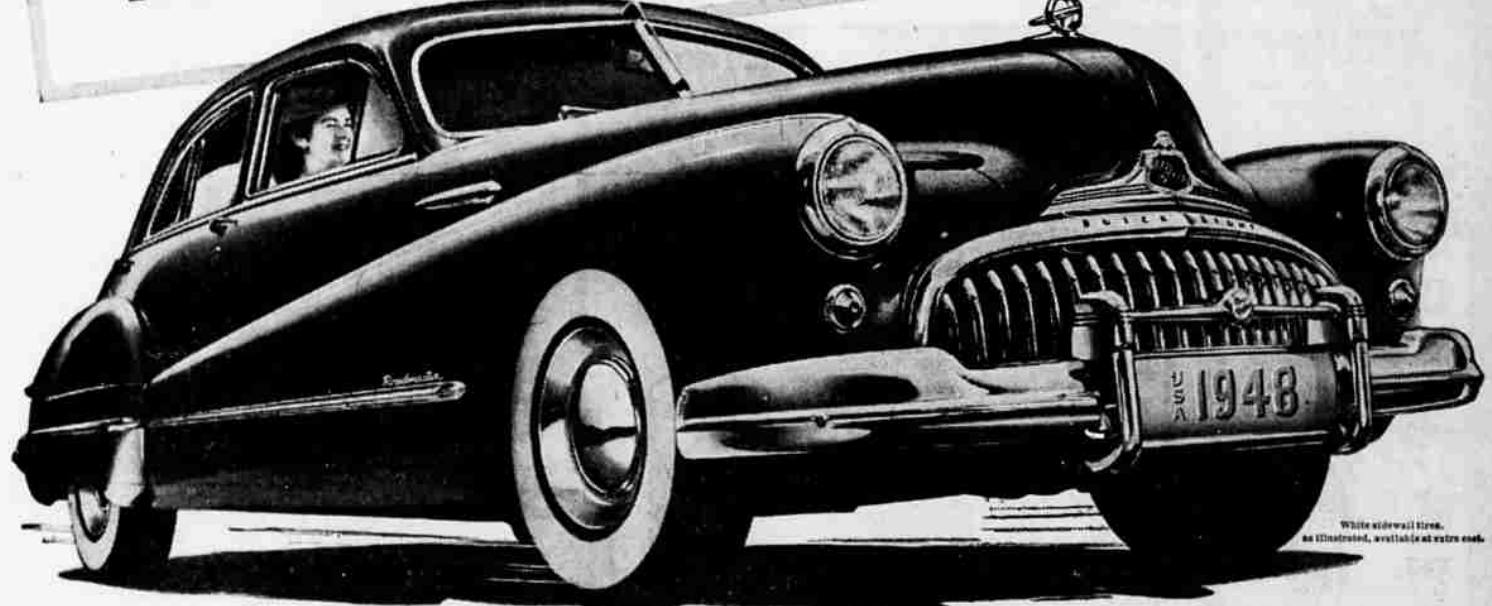
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
