CAP Contacts Skiers Today

CASCADE SUMMIT, Feb. 25 — The civil air patrol made its first attempt today to contact Jack Meissner and Emery Woodall during the 300-mile ski-trek from Mt. Hood to Crater lake, and reported the mission successfully completed. Ski tracks were first observed by the plane and followed until the two men were sighted as they made their way over the hard-crusted snow. Luxury items, including steaks, were dropped from the CAP plane before saluting the skiers and then winging its way back to base.

Jack's mother, Mrs. Florence Adkison, was informed by phone of the contacting of her son on his journey and was relieved to hear that he weathered the recent snowstorm in fine shape. Good forethought was shown by Jack and his partner, in that they carry snowshoes for use where skis are no good, such as places where the snow is too soft and yielding and also in snowstorms.

The success of this initial effort on the part of CAP inspired the Obidians and the Willamette ski patrol in the continuance of their plans to meet Jack and Emery at various points along the way, and George Korn, regional director of national ski-patrol system, hopes that their combined efforts will be equally successful.

Galente In Arizona Post

Word has been received here that Dr. Peter J. Galente, formerly of this area, has accepted a position as clinical director of the Whipple, Ariz., veterans administration hospital.

Dr. Galente was a tuberculosis specialist for the U. S. public health service, assigned to the Indian service and stationed at Klamath Agency a few years before the war. Mrs. Galente is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. W. Mocabee of 535 Jefferson.

Before going to Whipple, Dr. Galente was with the VA hospital at Swannanoa, N. C. During the war he was lieutenant colonel in the army medical corps.

Mrs. Galente and their two small children accompanied him to Whipple.

Thieves Steal Cash Register

FORT KLAMATH, Ore., Feb. 25—The Junction service station, located one mile south of Fort Klamath on highway 97 and operated by Mr. and Mrs. Joe Ball, was broken into and robbed some time Friday night, while the business was closed and the Balls away from home.

The music machine was broken, and the cash register carried away, the latter being found in a roadside ditch later by little Billie Zumbrun, whose home is on the adjacent Zumbrun ranch, and who was waiting for the school bus to Fort Klamath when he discovered the looted cash register.

Approximately \$75 was taken by the robbers, who have not been apprehended to date.

Two Milk Companies Face Price Charge

WASHINGTON, Feb. 25 (AP)—The justice department today announced the indictment of two dairy companies and six individuals "for conspiracy to fix the prices of fluid milk in the St. Louis area."

Attorney General Tom Clark said the action "is the first major indictment in the milk industry since the commencement of the program of the anti-trust division to prosecute illegal conspiracies to fix the prices of food, clothing and housing."

Clark also has ordered grand jury investigations of local milk prices in Chicago and Washington, D. C. The program was started last August.

The attorney general described the firms, the Pevely and the St. Louis Dairy companies, as the two largest dairies in St. Louis.

Educators Said Missing The Boat

PORTLAND, Feb. 25 (AP)—Educators tell the public too much about school financing needs and not enough about what they hope to teach Sis and Junior.

A committee of the Oregon Elementary Principals' association reported today the teachers are making their job of selling education more difficult by doing a poor job of public relations.

After a lengthy survey, the committee concluded:

"Satisfied patrons who are pleased with the work of their children and who understand what the school is attempting to accomplish, provide a receptive audience when it comes to balancing the budget."
