

# Partition Plan Delay Looms Today

LAKE SUCCESS, Feb. 25 (AP)—Delay in partitioning Palestine and perhaps even repeal of the whole scheme appeared possible today in the light of security council developments.

Columbia asked the United Nations to consider a special session of the general assembly to reconsider the partition plan. The United States asked for a Big Five committee of study and conciliation.

With this background, the council returned to debate (at noon PST) on the delicate issue.

The biggest question remaining is: What will Russia say? Well-informed sources said Delegate Andrei A. Gromyko promptly dispatched the text of the American speech to the Kremlin. Moscow's version of what to do about Palestine thus was expected to include some comment, perhaps sharp, on the American stand.

The U. S. and Russia, in a rare instance of cooperation, joined last November 29 to support partition in the general assembly. The plan calls for Jewish and Arab countries to be created next October 1.

In a long-awaited policy statement to the council yesterday, Chief U. S. Delegate Warren R. Austin said the council could not use armed force to carry out partition. He added, however, that the United States was ready to consult under the charter should the UN decide it was necessary to use international troops to maintain peace in the Holy Land.

Austin made no direct commitment of American troops. President Truman announced that he approved the speech.

The Arabs were understood to be generally pleased with Austin's speech. Zionist leaders were dismayed over the possible reopening of the whole plan.

# Lavrishev Takes Turkish Post

MOBSCOW, Feb. 25 (AP)—A. A. Lavrishev has been appointed Soviet ambassador to Turkey. It was announced Tuesday.

Lavrishev has had considerable experience in Balkan affairs. He formerly served as chief of the Balkan section of the foreign ministry, as Soviet minister to Bulgaria and as head of the Soviet delegation to the United Nations commission which originally investigated the Greek frontier.

He succeeds Sergei Vinogradov, who has been absent from Ankara more than two years.

# Schuman Gets Vote Of Confidence

PARIS, Feb. 25 (AP)—The French government won a vote of confidence in the national assembly Tuesday on a question of procedure posed by the communists.

The vote was 291 to 268. It was the sixth vote of confidence for Premier Robert Schuman since he took office November 23.

The vote came on a communist demand for immediate discussion of a peasant party bill which would have forced the government to pay before April 15 for all the 5000-franc notes voided and collected in the government's monetary reform.
