

# Hall, Newbry Visit; Mum On Politics

Governor John Hall, who plans to announce his political plans in about 10 days, and Secretary of State Earl Newbry, who has declined his candidacy for the office he holds, carefully avoided mention of politics and stuck mainly to a factual report on state affairs when they appeared as speakers at a joint Lions-chamber of commerce luncheon at the Willard Tuesday.

The state officials followed the luncheon with a quick inspection trip of the Oregon Vocational school Friday afternoon, and planned to leave in time to reach Medford for a series of appointments at 4 p. m.

The governor reiterated his advocacy of a further diversion of income surplus money to higher education and the state institutions. He said this could be done by the legislature or by the people through the initiative, preferably by the latter source.

# Hollywood Firms Burn

HOLLYWOOD, Feb. 25 (AP)—A spectacular, wind-whipped fire destroyed a lumber yard and a half dozen businesses, damaged a movie studio and sent scores of householders into the streets shortly before dawn today.

Estimates of damage ran as high as \$1,000,000.

Wind carried flaming brands six blocks, where firemen rescued Mr. and Mrs. John Cloyd Brown as flames burned away the roof of their \$40,000 home. Other home owners for blocks around poured water on their roofs as 83 pieces of fire equipment fought the main blaze for two hours.

A series of spot fires broke out on roofs of sound stages at General Service studios, but city and studio firemen extinguished them. Several dressing rooms also were damaged.

Preliminary damage estimates included \$500,000 to the lumber yard; \$250,000 to clothing, furs, rugs and machinery in a cleaning plant.

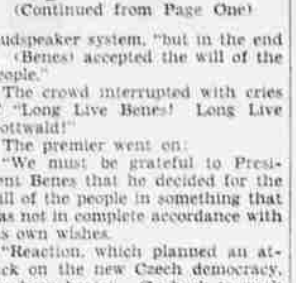
