

Spud Test Results Out

Results of an unofficial inspection last week of Klamath county seed potatoes at Oceanside have been mailed out to seed growers and also are available at the county agent's office.

Final inspection of the test plots is scheduled for March 1-3 with a grower field day set for March 4.

Emergence of plants at Oceanside was not uniform. Some plants were not yet through the ground last week, 100 days after planting. Some early emerging plants caught by the frost had not yet recovered. Stand of plants sufficiently advanced to permit inspection averaged 50 to 80 per cent.

Two weeks additional growth will make possible a more thorough inspection. Leafroll symptoms last week, however, were very definitely expressed. As a result of the inspection last week, 16 Klamath county certified Russet seed lots are certain to be eliminated as seed stock. These 16 lots carry in excess of 1 per cent leafroll infection. A few lots ran as high as 6 per cent leafroll infection.

Guard Plans Drive Here

Klamath Falls units of the 965th field artillery battalion of the National guard are planning a large scale recruiting drive from March 1 to 6.

Ten officers and 200 enlisted men are needed to bring the three batteries to their authorized strength of 23 officers and 260 enlisted men.

Included in the local unit is headquarters and headquarters battery with authorized strength of 13 officers and 113 enlisted men, service battery with authorized strength of five officers and 55 enlisted men and "B" battery with five officers and 77 enlisted men. The units are organized in accordance with army rulings and will have a full issue of necessary equipment.

There are still a number of vacancies for ex-servicemen to enlist at the grade held when they were discharged if they have the proper classification for the existing vacancies.

Solon Blasts Krug Policy

WASHINGTON, Feb. 26 (AP).—Senator Downey (D-Calif.) said Wednesday that Secretary of Interior J. A. Krug was involved in a "sleazy and despicable conspiracy" to stop work on the California Central valley reclamation project.

The senate appropriations committee, he said, has "documentary evidence that the secretary of interior conspired, and consorting with employees, set out to spend all available funds by January 1."

The senator repeated his previous statements that the bureau had attempted to spend by January 1 money which congress voted last year for a 12-month period ending next June 30.

Downey addressed the senate after Senator Knowland (R-Calif.) read memoranda dated last June and signed by Richard L. Boke, Sacramento regional director of the reclamation bureau and R. S. Calhoun, assistant regional director.

The memoranda stated that Krug wanted available funds for Central valley project construction spent by January 1.

Bureau officials have stated under oath that Krug referred to "carryover" funds, not the 1948 appropriation.

Knowland accused reclamation bureau officials of giving the appropriations committee "misinformation" on the status of Central valley project funds.

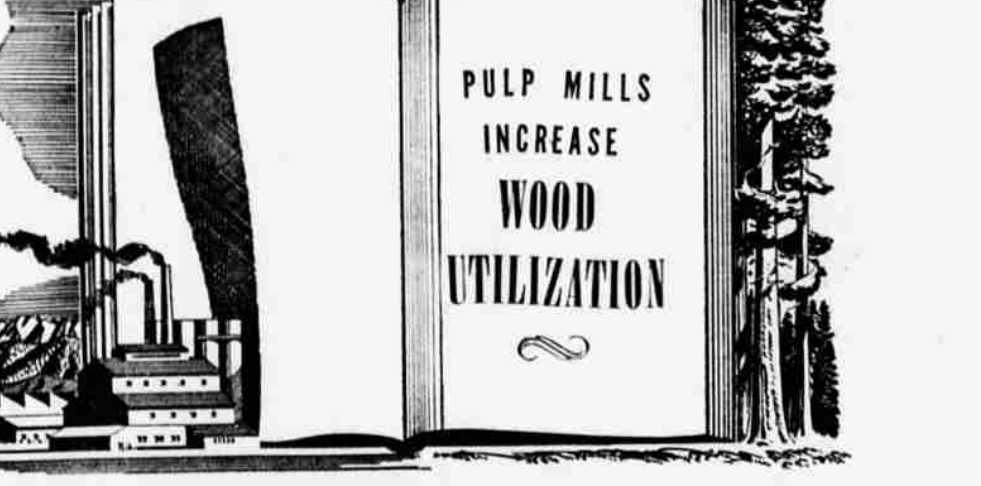
