Kaiser Cuts Production

DETROIT, Feb. 27 (AP)—The Kaiser-Frazer corp. announced Thursday an "economy" cutback of operations, including elimination of the night shift at its Willow Run plant and the layoff of 3200 workers.

The move will mean an "appreciable" lowering of the plant's auto production, now nearing an average of 1000 units a day, according to a company spokesman.

Edgar F. Kaiser, vice president and general manager, said the cutback resulted from "an economy drive in the face of mounting costs that have forced several auto manufacturers recently to raise prices."

The new one-shift operations are scheduled to start March 5. The cutback is to bring total employment at Willow Run to 14,500.

Czechs Slip Over Border

NEUHAUSEN, Germany, Feb. 27 (AP)—At least 10 Czechs are known to have slipped through their border patrols near this frontier town this week, reaching the U. S. zone of Germany under cover of darkness.

The only traffic across the heavily-guarded Czechoslovak frontier since the Prague political crisis developed has been at night and by stealth.

All official crossing points are closed and guarded by armed, uniformed men.
