Federal Road Aid Proposed

WASHINGTON, Feb. 27 (AP)—Senator Cordon (R-Ore.) said Thursday congress ought to extend indefinitely a \$500,000,000 a year federal-state highway aid program.

"All the facts at hand indicate it must be a continuing program," he told a senate public works subcommittee.

He said it was "uneconomical" to extend it for only two years, as proposed by other bills before the committee. A house public works subcommittee approved such a bill yesterday.

Cordon's proposal was backed by Senator Morse (R-Ore.) but opposed by the U. S. chamber of commerce, in a statement filed with the committee. The chamber, however, said there is need for federal-state cooperation in advance planning for highways.

Cordon's bill also calls for authorization of \$25,000,000 annually for development of forest highways, and \$12,500,000 annually for forest-development roads and trails. Both authorizations would be for an indefinite period.

Reds Mark Anniversary

MOSCOW, Feb. 27 (AP)—Russia celebrated today the hundredth anniversary of the communist manifesto.

Moscow newspapers devoted most of their front pages to the occasion. Trud, trade-union organ, said in its commentary:

"The power and vitality of the ideas of the manifesto are shown in the fact that a hundred years ago there were not more than 300 communists in the world.

"Today there are 20,000,000 people in the ranks of the communist party."

A commentator in the army newspaper Red Star said, "communism has broken through into the wide open spaces. Forward!"

The communist manifesto was written by Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels, Germans, as a statement of principles for a European communist league. It was published in February, 1848.

The manifesto pictures history as a series of class struggles, the latest between capital and labor. It calls for a workers' revolution to establish common ownership of the means of production.

Jones To Head Farmers Union

SALEM, Feb. 27 (AP)—Ronald E. Jones, Brooks onion grower and former state senator, was reelected president of the Oregon Farmers union at the closing session of its three-day convention yesterday.

The new vice president is J. G. Matzke, Clackamas county.

Resolutions passed by the convention ask congress to help get more machinery for farmers, favor a congressional investigation of timber sales policies, creation of the office of lieutenant governor, and require all government employees earning more than \$9000 a year to make public the source of all their income.

OSC Schools Plan Split

PORTLAND, Feb. 27 (AP)—The division of business and industry at Oregon State college will be advanced to a school of business and technology, the state board of higher education decided last night.

The change was recommended by the board's curriculum committee, as a step in expanding the business training program started at Oregon State in 1943.

The new school will not duplicate the University of Oregon school of business administration, and will offer no graduate work, Dr. Charles D. Byrne, board secretary, said.

Nine hundred students are now enrolled in the division, which is to be re-designated a school. The board said students majoring in the school must take at least 36 hours in a "technical minor"—such as agriculture, forestry, engineering or home economics.

Several new courses in auditing, finance and industrial traffic management were added to the curriculum. The school will emphasize training in the combined fields of business and technology.
