Grain Futures Range Lower

CHICAGO, March 2 (AP)—Grain futures ranged lower in the board of trade session today. The decline in corn was the sharpest. Selling by commission houses uncovered stop loss orders, and the deferred deliveries scored heaviest losses.

Wheat followed corn downward. More moisture over the winter wheat section, and lack of indications of government buying were factors in the decline. The local commodity credit corporation announced no purchases were made yesterday.

At the finish wheat was 1/4 to 1/2 lower than yesterday's close. May \$2.45-\$2.44. Corn was 1 cent to 3/4 lower, May \$2.26. Oats were 1/4 higher to 1/2 cents lower, May \$1.14 1/4-1/2. Soybeans were 1/4 to 5/8 higher, March \$3.67 1/2.

Some Stocks Gain Today

NEW YORK, March 2 (AP)—Buying of oils and assorted industrials gave the stock market another selective recovery tilt today although the move was far from unanimous.

While gains of fractions to a point or so were well distributed near the close, numerous losers remained.

Dealers quickened at intervals and, notwithstanding slowdowns, volume of around 800,000 shares was among the largest since mid-February.

Better performers included Mission Corp. and Pacific Western Oil, on a revival of merger talk; Standard Oil (N.J.), Du Pont, Bethlehem Steel, Paramount Pictures and Illinois Central.

Resistant were Boeing, Transcontinental & Western Air, Chrysler, Deere, Oliver Farm and Owens-Illinois. Twentieth Century-Fox was about even despite a sliced dividend.

Bonds were mixed with some rails improving. Cotton, toward the finish, was off 15 to 40 cents a bale.

At Chicago wheat ended down 1/4 to 3/4 of a cent a bushel, corn off 1/4 to 3/4 and oats up 1/4 to 1/2 off 1/4.

Highest Mountain Search Launched

OAKLAND, Calif., March 2 (AP)—The Reynolds scientific party, bound for Asia in search of a mountain higher than Everest, took off at 7:33 a. m. (PST) today.

Bill Odom, Everest-the-world flier, was at the controls of the converted C-87 transport.

The first stop will be Honolulu. The party plans refueling landings at Wake, Okinawa, Tokyo and Shanghai. It will establish an operations base at Lang Chow and proceed with its projected exploration of the Amne Machin mountains in Hopes province.

Milton Reynolds, wealthy Chicagoan whose fancies have turned to aviation and exploration, heads the expedition.

Building Figure Down

Building in February this year fell far below the same month in 1947. Monthly total this year is \$92,968 compared to February, '47's tally of \$250,004.

Big item on the February, 1947 building permit list was remodeling the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph building at 8th and Pine, which alone came to \$120,000.
