

'Frozen' Lot Tangle Ends In Peace

After a week of digging through city files, the city made last night straightened out a Hillside addition property tangle. Last week councilmen decided that nearly all of a group of 12 lots in the area were sold, although they were originally ordered withheld from sale by the city. The search through city records disclosed that the lots were not sold, after all.

The 12 lots stacked up like this: five are owned by the city and have never had offers for purchase and on the other seven the city has accepted deposits from persons interested in buying it, pending release of the property.

Councilman A. F. Condrey stated that the present office force should not be criticized since the mix-up occurred in 1946. Dr. C. J. Cox who was in the audience, told councilmen that should the lots be released for sale, deposits accepted should be returned so that everyone will have an equal chance at purchase.

Upshot of the discussion was that the property will be released for sale after a new appraisal is conducted, and councilmen voted that the city advertise for sealed bids after the appraisal for the property's purchase. Deposits already accepted will be returned.

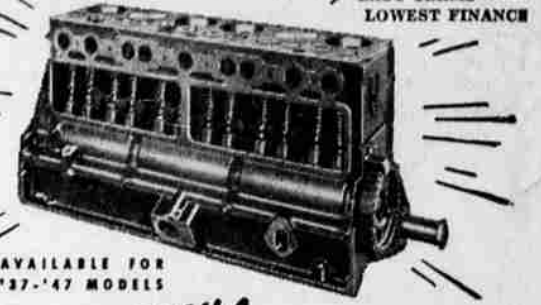

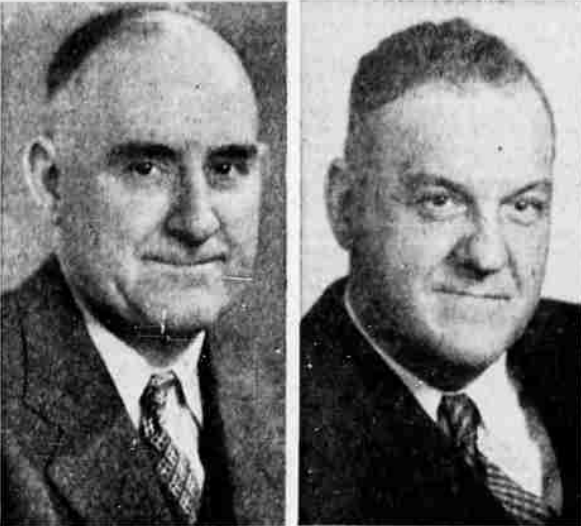

Dr. Compton Returns Here

Dr. Arthur M. Compton, Klamath Falls surgeon, has returned here from Chicago where he was certified by the American Board of Orthopedic Surgery at the annual meeting of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons. This is the highest rating a doctor can get in a specialty and Dr. Compton received the certification following a two-day examination, both written and oral, conducted at Northwestern university.

The Klamath Falls surgeon passed the first section of the examination two years ago at Stanford, the second part given in Chicago. Requirements include five years of special training in the orthopedic field after the doctor's internship. Orthopedic surgery consists of fractures, dislocations, sprains and accident surgery in general.
