

Race Problem Big Issue In Appropriations Order Withholding Federal Funds

WASHINGTON, March 5 (AP)—The GOP-dominated house appropriations committee jumped into the civil rights fight today. It called upon congress to withhold federal money for hospital building and for vocational education from states which deny Negroes equal opportunities to jobs and education financed by that money.

The recommendation was written into a \$1,817,851,000 bill to supply the labor department and the federal security agency with funds for the year starting July 1.

No Explanation
There was no formal explanation of the anti-discrimination order written into the measure at the height of a southern dramatic uprising against President Truman's civil rights program.

However, Rep. Keefe (R-Wisc.) who pushed the provision through the committee, told reporters the committee feels that states should "not be allowed to discriminate with federal funds."

Upwards of \$170,000,000 of the bill's funds are affected by the provision. The largest of these is \$135,600,000 for hospital construction. On these funds, the states and local governments put up two dollars for each dollar furnished by the federal government.

Keefe said there was no intention on his or the committee's part to require whites and Negroes to attend the same schools, rather only an insistence that Negroes be given equal chances.

The committee put off for future study budget requests of \$989,523,000 for the United States employment service, the social security administration and mental health activities of the public health service.

USBI Plan Eased
By way of explanation the committee said the United States employment service, which includes the veterans employment service, now is the subject of a presidential reorganization plan which the house, but not the senate, has rejected.

The social security allotment was held up because of certain changes now in progress.

Here is what the committee recommended for certain major activities financed in the bill:
Department of labor—\$12,498,200, a cut of \$4,102,000 from the president's request; in addition, \$373,001 of current year funds were recalled.
Federal security agency—\$239,788,

Ammonia Tank Blast Kills 1

PITTSBURGH, March 5 (AP)—One man was killed and five persons injured today by the explosion of an ammonia tank at the Denholm Packing company.

The victim was James Bell, about 45, a stationary engineer.

Approximately 100 employees were in the building, 20 of them women. Many escaped the ammonia fumes by climbing down firemen's ladders. Two fire alarms were sounded and nearly a score of ambulances were sent to the meat packing plant, located in Pittsburgh's busy East Liberty section. Nearby residents reported scores of windows were broken.

Three of the injured were admitted to a hospital for ammonia poisoning. They were Albert Evans, 37, John Walsh, 54, and Robert J. Kerr, 33. All were reported in critical condition.

Pire Chief William Davis estimated damage at \$15,000.

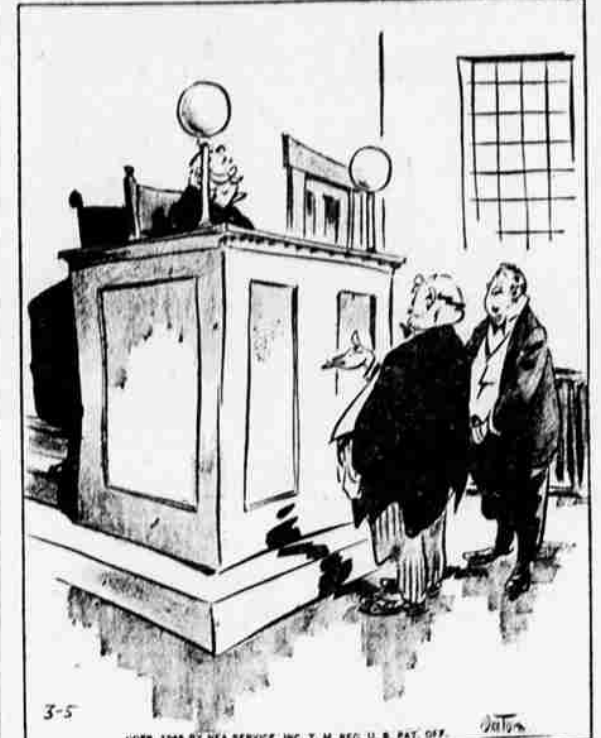
Poisoners Kill

Lloyd Gift and Charles Partridge were re-elected supervisors of the Langell Valley Soil Conservation District at the annual meeting held at Lorella grange hall Tuesday night.

The meeting followed a potluck dinner which was attended by many Langell farmers and their families as well as numerous visitors.

The annual report was read by V. J. Barnes, showing that 1820 acres of land was leveled and planned during the war, and 15 miles of drains were dug.

Total of drains dug since the formation of the district is 50 miles, affecting 6897 acres of land. The district includes 150,192 acres of which \$3,722 are privately owned land.

Terry White, range management supervisor of the soil conservation region, made a talk outlining the world food and economic situation as it relates to the need for soil conservation practices.

Lumber Union Battles For Idaho Spots

LEWISTON, Ida., March 5 (AP)—Rival lumber unions are staging final membership drives in the Idaho Panhandle among the 3000 employees of Potlatch Forests, Inc., preparing for next week's national labor relations board election.

Leaders of both the CIO International Woodworkers of America and the AFL Lumber and Sawmill Workers union will make radio appeals here Tuesday for support at the polls Wednesday and Thursday.

Officials said 11 NLRB examiners would collect votes from 18 polling places in mills at Lewiston, Potlatch and Coeur d'Alene and at 13 logging camps from Coeur d'Alene to Lewiston.

The CIO has represented Potlatch workers since 1944. The coming election will be the AFL's second comeback attempt.
