

Newberg Gets Into Tourney

Newberg bounded into the class A state tournament last night, and as many as seven other teams may qualify tonight for Oregon's annual high school basketball tourney.

Newberg, crowd-pleaser in last year's tournament at Eugene, got in by winning the district a title from Dallas, 52-29, in the finals of a playoff at McMinnville. Don Hoy, named to the second all-state team last year, scored 12 points, as did Claude "Lefty" Nordhill, to lead the Newberg team.

Delong Nearing Records

RIVER FALLS, Wis., March 6 (AP)—Sethan John De Long Junior is within shooting distance today of four national individual basketball scoring records.

The big center from River Falls State Teachers college, who has led the nation's scorers all season, wound up his 22-game schedule with 618 points on 209 field goals and 200 free throws.

His game average—28.1 points—virtually assures him of top ranking this year and gives him a second place lead for all-time single season scoring with Paynter of Wheaton (Ill.) college, according to national collegiate athletic bureau records. Paynter counted 451 points in 16 games during the 1944 season. Brooms Abramovic of Salem (W.Va.) college leads the department with a 29.9 average in 1942.

Another Abramovic record—college career scoring—also seems within De Long's grasp. The West Virginian averaged 22.5 on 216 points in 96 games during 1939-43. The rangy Wisconsin center has averaged 23.58 on 1391 points in 59 games. He still has the better part of two seasons to play.

De Long seemingly has clinched his year's single game scoring crown with 72 points on 25 baskets and 7 free throws, made against Winona (Minn.) Teachers. The mark is third for all-time, ranking behind an 83 point outburst by Bryant Lincoln Memorial in 1945 and 85 by Anderson of Bucknell in 1933.

Local Man Gets Patent On Tube Dispenser Gadget

A tube dispenser for household use has been invented by H. A. Dittmanson, 727 Lincoln street, who is now negotiating through brokers for manufacture of the device.

The dispenser would be made of molded parts with plastic housing of any color desired. It would be constructed for mounting on the wall of a bathroom or kitchen, and would also be useful in hospitals, garages, physicians' offices and any other place where there is frequent use of materials coming from tubes, such as tooth paste and shaving cream.

Use of the dispenser is simple. The tube is inserted between two tooth rollers, which can be turned by twisting a corrugated plastic knob. As the tube is emptied, it is turned up into the dispenser between the rollers, and a guide brings the empty tube around and out of a hole at the bottom.

Dittmanson has patented the device and correspondence with brokers indicates a certain manufacture of the article. The Klamath man has already received favorable offers for it.
