

Portland Art Show Slated

Dates of the fifth all-Oregon, non-jury art exhibit have been announced by the Portland Art Museum as July 31 to August 31 inclusive. Entries will be received from July 12 to 17 inclusive and a special preview for artists and their friends will be held Friday evening July 30.

This exhibit is open to artists living or working in Oregon and the communities along the Columbia River.

Work may be submitted on canvas, painting board or paper in mediums of oil, tempera, watercolor and pastel; sculpture in clay, plaster, metal, stone and wood. All work must be original and executed within the past two years. No copies will be accepted.

GALESBURG, Ill., March 11 (AP)—Because W. E. Bloomfield's two dogs understood his command to "go call Mama," he was rescued from beneath his automobile which pinned him down.

Bloomfield, 45-year-old farmer of nearby North Henderson, was jacking up his car yesterday when the jack slipped. He was caught beneath the running board.

He shouted for help until hoarse, but his wife was washing clothes in the basement and did not hear him.

"Go call Mama," Bloomfield told his dogs.

The dogs ran to the basement window and barked until Mrs. Bloomfield came out. Then they guided her to her husband. Unable to raise the car, she phoned a neighbor for help.

Former Nazis Get Prison Terms

NUERNBERG, Germany, March 11 (AP)—Eight S. S. (elite guard) officers who carried out the Heinrich Himmler program of exterminating racial elements undesirable to the nazis were sentenced Wednesday to prison terms ranging from 10 years to life.

Gen. Ulrich Greifelt, Himmler deputy whom the court termed a main driving force in the Germanization program, received a life term in an American war crimes court.

After six months of trial, the court, headed by Judge Lee B. Wyatt of La Grange, Ga., convicted the

eight of war crimes and crimes against humanity. Five others were convicted of S. S. membership but acquitted of war crimes. A 14th defendant, a woman, was cleared. She is Inge Viermetz, deputy chief of the "Lebensborn" organization which placed children in German homes.

PORTLAND, March 11 (AP)—Police today were trying to learn the identity of an elderly traffic victim who was carrying \$900 in cash when struck by an automobile.

Patrolman Arnold Oatley said the car driver, Marvin L. Hill, 27, reported the man stopped as if to allow the car to pass, and then stepped in front of the vehicle. Hill was cited for failure to yield right-of-way to a pedestrian.

The death was the sixth Portland traffic fatality this year.
