Coulson Heads Sportsmen

TULELAKE, March 12—John Coulson has been re-elected president of the Tulelake-Butte Valley Sportsman's association.

Rudessil will serve as vice president and L. E. Booth will fill the secretary's chair again.

Ben Schultz and Otis Roper have been appointed to draw a line of demarcation in the controversy over the suggested absorption of the petroglyphs by that agency.

Taft Asks Slash In ERP Payments

WASHINGTON, March 12 (AP)—Senator Taft (R-Ohio) Thursday introduced an amendment to slash the \$5,300,000,000 authorization for European relief to \$4,000,000,000.

Taft's single-handed sponsorship of the amendment came as a surprise. It has been indicated previously that it would be introduced by one or more of a GOP revisionist group, headed by Senator Wherry (R-Neb.).

His action came shortly after President Truman asked congress for an additional \$55,000,000 to help tide Western Europe over until the European recovery program is enacted.

CRANDALL CHOSEN FOR DIVISION GUARD SPOT

LOS ANGELES, March 12 (AP)—Washington's northern division Pacific Coast conference basketball champions placed two men on the 1948 northern division all-star team.

The conference commissioner's office said today Jack Nichols, Washington center, was the only unanimous choice of the division coaches, but was slipped into a forward berth along with teammate Sammy White to make room for Washington State's Vince Hanson.

Cliff Crandall, Oregon State, Preston Brimhall of Idaho and Stan Williamson of Oregon are guard choices—the latter two tying in the voting.

It was Nichols' fifth year of all-star rating. He hit the northern division squad as a freshman in 1944

and again last season. In 1945 and 1946 he made the southern division selections as a naval trainee at Southern California.

Second team selections paired Gayda of Washington State and Winkins of Oregon at forward; and Wiley of Oregon at center. Three guards tied for second team honors: Washington's Taylor, Idaho's Grove and Oregon State's Ballentyne.

Casaba Flag Up

BERKELEY, Calif., March 12 (AP)—The University of California Bears and Washington Huskies meet here tonight in the first game of a series to decide the Pacific coast conference 1948 basketball championship.

Cochman Price's Bears, beaten only once in their last 15 starts, will be running for their seventh conference title under Price.

The Californians, playing on their home court, are favored, although the Huskies hold two practice game decisions over them early in the season.

In favor of California is the fact the Bears sewed up the southern division title early. The Huskies had to battle down to the last and went into a one-game playoff at the end of the regular season to decide the northern division race.

Tipoff time tonight is for 8:30 o'clock. A second game will be played tomorrow, and, if necessary, a third on Monday.

Coast Guard Gets Distress Signal

SEATTLE, March 12 (AP)—The coast guard said today its Westport, Wash., radio station had picked up a call from the fishing vessel Wellamo saying "We are on bar—out of gas—North Spit."

No other message has been received and the coast guard said it has been unable to communicate with the boat.

Only two points on the west coast are identified as the North Spit, the coast guard said. One is at Coos Bay, Ore., and the other at Humboldt, Calif.

The Wellamo is carried in coast guard records as being owned by William and J. T. Haavisto of Seattle.

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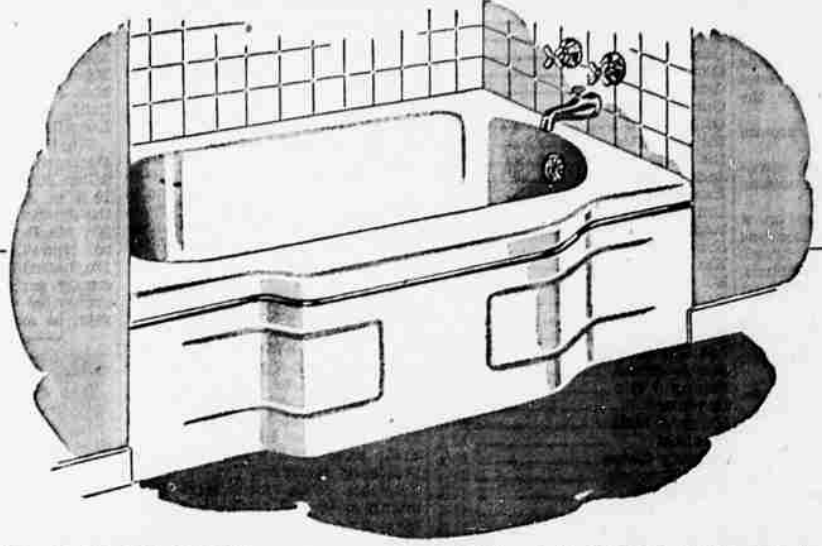
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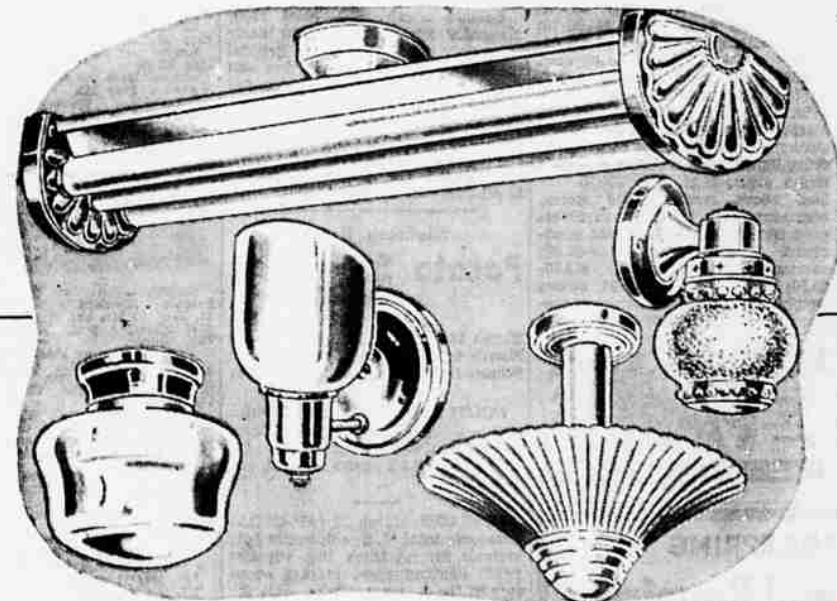
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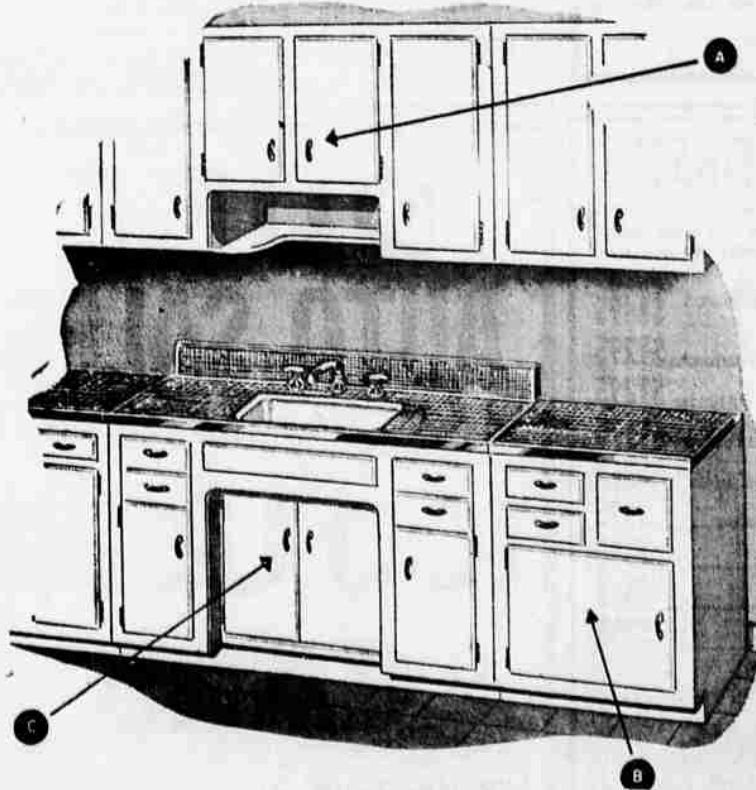


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
