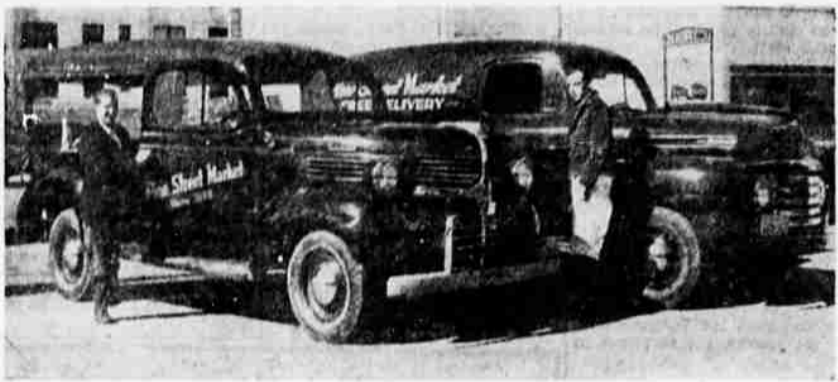
It is gratifying to know that Klamath county has 2843 members attending our PTA's, which is more than at any former time.
