

### Cattlemen's Meeting Set For Wednesday

Henry Gerber, president of the Klamath Cattlemen's association, has called a meeting of the association for 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at the Winema hotel. All Klamath county cattlemen are requested to attend.

Speakers include Dr. Fred F. McKenzie, chairman of the department of animal husbandry, Oregon State college; Dr. C. L. Haynes, state veterinarian, and Sherman Guttridge, president of the Oregon Cattle and Horse Raisers association.

Dr. McKenzie will talk about factors affecting livestock production. Dr. Haynes is concerned with the threat of hoof and mouth disease to the Oregon livestock industry. He will discuss the quarantine on all cattle coming into the state that the state department of agriculture is going to enforce.

Guttridge will tell the cattlemen what the Cattle and Horse Raisers association is doing for the livestock industry. A short business meeting is also scheduled.

### Air Force Quota Set

The department of air announced this week, according to Elmer Thurling of the local U. S. army and U. S. air force recruiting service in Klamath Falls, that a quota limiting the number of enlistments in the air force has been established.

This quota, which includes those for the month of March, has been set at 4000 per month in the United States. Broken down into recruiting areas, this allows the Oregon district, which also includes Southwestern Washington and Southwest Idaho, 50 per month. The quota of 50 affects all enlistments except those men re-enlisting within 90 days to fill their own vacancies, those re-enlisting within 90 days to maintain their discharge grade, and high school graduates enlisting for the aviation career plan. This latter plan allows high school graduates to select the service or technical school they wish to attend before they enlist in the air force.

Further restrictions, according to Thurling, reveal that no married men will be accepted for original enlistments, and enlistments for less than three years are not allowed. Nor will original enlistees be granted waivers for age, physical defects or failure to meet the mental standards. However, waivers will be considered for prior servicemen for age, physical defects and in cases of combat wounded.

The recruiter concluded this announcement by explaining that the above restrictions do not apply to the United States army.

### WTC Releases Color Film
