Grain Shows Moderate Gain

CHICAGO, March 16 (AP)—Moderate gains were made in the grain futures pits at the board of trade today. Buying, said to reflect removal of hedges against sales of cash grain to the government strengthened the market after an irregular start.

Later profit-taking reduced the day's best prices. The commodity credit corporation revised its buying formula today. Midway through the morning session the department of agriculture buying agency said it would receive offers of cash grain only from 11 a. m. to noon daily, and accept or reject during that hour. Previously the agency had until 5 p. m. to decide.

Wheat closed 1/4 to 3/8 cents higher than the previous finish, May \$2.41 1/2-3/4. Corn was 1/8 lower to 1 cent higher, May \$2.20 1/2-3/4. Oats were 1/8 lower to 1 1/2 higher, May \$1.13 1/2-3/4. Soybeans were unchanged to 1 cent higher, March \$3.54.

Leaders dropped 1 to 3 or more points in a fast forenoon skid. Extreme losses were shaded near the close. Transfers were around 800,000 shares.

The reaction was the sharpest in a month. Steels, motors, aircrafts, amusements, oils and a wide assortment of industrials suffered.
