

European Recovery Group Votes Western Germany Into Marshall Aid Plan

The 16-nation European recovery conference voted unanimously today to include Western Germany in the Marshall plan.

The delegates met in Paris in an atmosphere of world crisis, at what Secretary of State Marshall has described as a fateful hour.

Portugal urged the delegates to admit Spain to the program, to be financed by the U. S. treasury. The U. S. senate Sunday voted a \$5,300,000,000 program for the first year of Marshall plan operation.

While the delegates whipped into shape a Marshall plan union of non-communist Europe viewed by the West as a bulwark against Soviet expansion, the tension of the current situation was reflected in capitals throughout the world.

Truman Speech
Washington awaited a joint session of congress tomorrow, when President Truman will discuss the world situation. There is speculation that stepped-up Russian pressure is expected on non-communist Europe.

Members of congress think there may be Russian moves in prospect toward Sweden, Norway and Denmark similar to pressure placed upon Finland for a military agree-

ment. If such moves were successful it might help the communists swing the crucial Italian elections April 18, and after Italy the Russians may fix their attention on Turkey, members of congress say.

Stockholm exhibited nervousness. Gen. Heige Jung, commander-in-chief of Sweden's armed forces, in a report last night to King Gustav V., mentioned the "brusque methods" of Russia. He said more money, manpower, materials and industrial capacity are needed to bring Sweden's "coup" preparedness to a higher level.

Sweden's eyes were on Finland. Delegates of that Scandinavian nation already have been assigned to Moscow to negotiate for a treaty of friendship and mutual assistance. President Juho E. Paasikivi has informed Stalin Finland does not want a military tie.

Storm Seen
The mention of "coup preparedness" also recalled the situation in Czechoslovakia, which may cause a storm tomorrow in the United Nations security council. It seemed unlikely that Russia could block an airing at Lake Success of the coup in which the communists seized power in Prague.

The communist party in Czechoslovakia meanwhile announced extension of its grip to the school system.

The education ministry announced a compulsory system for children up to 15 and a work-study plan for those of 15 or over. Those who cannot pass scholarship tests at 15 must work in trades or industry.

In Italy, where a crucial test of communist power will come with the April 18 elections, the government has added 20,000 well-armed army men to the public security forces. Vice Premier Rinaldo Ossola said that, with this aid, security forces "can break any illegal attempt from the left."

The forces will be distributed strategically for the post-election period to meet any attempted revolt. Paasikivi said he added that he did not believe the communists could win a majority in the election.

In the midst of the spreading nervousness, Russia announced she will reduce her army to the 21-year-old and 22-year-old age groups by March 31, when all the older groups will be mobilized. Russia has not announced figures on her army's current strength or its planned strength. Last December, Rep. Charles A. Eaton (R-N.J.) said Russia had an army of 4,050,000 men. He said he got the figure from the war department.

41 Japs Get Death Jolt

YOKOHAMA, March 16 (AP)—The greatest mass execution order resulting from Pacific war atrocities today sentenced 41 former Japanese navy men to be hanged.

Two others were sentenced to prison at hard labor—one for 29 years and one for five. Two were acquitted.

Defense attorneys who had struggled through the four months trial said they were stunned by the long list of death sentences ordered by a U. S. military tribunal.

The charges involved the beheading of Navy Lt. Vernon L. Tebo of

Pensacola, Fla., and Radioman Warren H. Loyd of Forest Hills, N. Y., and the bayonetting to death of Ordnanceman Robert Tuggle of Brownwood, Tex. The three American airmen were shot down over a Pacific island and captured by the Japanese in April, 1945.

Tuggle was bayoneted by 40 Japanese after he had been tied to a stake and beaten.
