SARASOTA, Fla., March 17 (AP)—With only a batting drill called by Manager Joe McCarthy, today will be just about a day off for the Boston Red Sox.

McCarthy was pleased with the improved showings of Pitches Mickey Harris and Dave Ferriss. Harris, although touched for both of the Phillies' runs yesterday in the Sox' 5-2 triumph over Philadelphia, said his arm felt "fine." Ferriss was unmoved on in three innings.

Both were bothered with sore arms last year.

Stanky is recovering from an illness variously described as lobar pneumonia and a virus infection. He was X-rayed yesterday after Boston scored once in the 14th inning to defeat Detroit, 4-3, at Lakeland.

CHICAGO HANDS RING 23-DAY LAYOFF JOLT

CHICAGO, March 17 (AP)—Representatives of the ring death in Chicago last month of Sam Baroudi were capped today by suspension of professional boxing in Illinois for 23 days.

The shutdown was asked by Gov. Dwight H. Green yesterday and Commission Chairman Sheldon Clark said the request was accepted.

The move climaxes criticism of pro boxing stemming from the death on February 21 of Baroudi, 29-year-old Akron, O., boxer, after his 10th round knockout by Ezzard Charles of Cincinnati.

The ban will be lifted April 7, date of the Chicago stadium benefit to raise \$10,000 for Baroudi's parents. The bout will be between Charles and Elmer (Violent) Ray of Minneapolis.

The only major boxing show affected by the ban is the 10-round bout between Ray Robinson, world's welterweight champion, and George Abrams of New York, which had been scheduled for the international amphitheater March 31.

Semler Yanks Move Ahead In AAU Play

DENVER, Colo., March 17 (AP)—The Semler Yanks of Portland, Ore., undefeated in pre-tourney play, moved into the third round of the national AAU basketball tournament today.

The Oregon team knocked over Milwaukee, Wis., a seeded entry, last night 76-69 with Ray Bachofner setting a fast scoring pace of 33 points.

The win paired the Portland quintet with the Annapolis, Md. navy entry in today's battle at 3:30 p. m. (PST).

Yesterday's firing trimmed the tournament field from 48 to 16 teams—but failed to make a dent on the top favorites—Bartlesville, Denver Nuggets, Oakland and Hollywood.

Hollywood and the Nuggets made initial tourney appearances and racked up one-sided triumphs. The Movie City five eliminated Billings, Mont., 65-27, and Denver brushed past Weatherford, Okla., 73-39.

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ERP Strategy Ready To Go After Okay

PARIS, March 17 (AP)—American dollars will start clanking on European counters almost as soon as President Truman's pen is dry after signing the European reconstruction bill.

A high American source in Paris said the machinery is all set to begin parcelling out the long-awaited Marshall plan aid as soon as the program gets past the house of representatives and the president signs it.

The program already has senate approval in the amount of \$5,300,000,000. House leaders in Washington have set April 1 as a target date for passage there.

"All America demands of the organization now being born in Paris is a serious indication that these countries are willing to work together and help themselves," the informant said. "They can start receiving aid even before they have an organization of their own if we feel sure they are going to have one eventually."

The long-term program calls for an administrator stationed in Washington, but until he is appointed the president may direct the program.
