

# City Briefs

## WEATHER

**WESTERN OREGON:** Partly cloudy today and tonight with scattered light showers decreasing by evening. Highly variable weather with high near 50. Cloudy with occasional rain Thursday, becoming showery in north by afternoon. Cooler in north Thursday with high near 50. Low tonight 30 to 40. Gentle to moderate north winds off coast, becoming southwesterly Thursday and increasing in fresh to locally strong and shifting in northwest again late Thursday.

**EASTERN OREGON:** Partly cloudy today tonight and Thursday with scattered showers, mostly in afternoon. Nightly cooler tonight with lows of 23 to 30. Highs 40 to 50.

**KLAMATH FALLS AND VICINITY:** High clouds tonight. Thursday cloudy with rain by afternoon, changing to snow by late afternoon. High today about 45. Low tonight 18. High Thursday 37.

## Colombia City Blazing Today

BOGOTA, Colombia, March 17 (AP)—Airlines pilots flying between Bogota and Barranquilla said today a fire raging at Mananguare has consumed 16 city blocks.

Mananguare, with a population of 30,000, is 125 miles south of Barranquilla, on the Magdalena river. Early reports said the fire had made 3000 persons homeless.

Three children and two men were said to have died in the flames, believed to have started in a straw stack. Nearly 800 houses were reported destroyed.

## Socialist In Mayor Race

MILWAUKEE, March 17 (AP)—Frank P. Zeidler, 35-year-old socialist, and Attorney Henry B. Reuss, 36, appeared the winners in Milwaukee's mayoralty primary election yesterday.

Zeidler, whose brother Carl was former mayor, and Reuss topped the field of 15 candidates and will compete for the \$12,500 a year mayoral post in the April 6 election.

Zeidler polled 49,818 votes on the basis of complete unofficial returns from the city's 499 precincts. Reuss received 38,369 votes for runner-up honors.

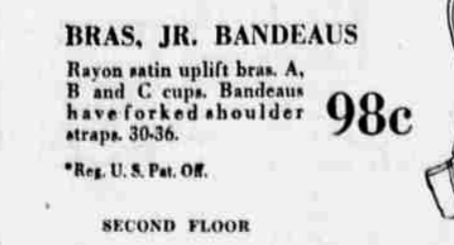
