

# Reds Battle Against UN Czech Probe

LAKE SUCCESS, March 18 (AP)—Russia seemed grimly determined today to fight on against a United Nations inquiry into the communist grab of Czechoslovakia.

A decisive East-West clash over Soviet expansion in Europe is in prospect.

The UN security council voted yesterday, over strenuous Soviet objections, to hear all that can be turned up on the Czechoslovak crisis.

**Name Calling**  
The decision was taken against a backdrop of bitter name-calling by Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko. Applause for speakers answering Gromyko's thrusts echoed three times in the packed, usually staid council chamber.

The council set next Monday for the start of debate on the case, filed last Friday by the government of Chile against Russia.

Gromyko called the Chilean complaint a dirty and slanderous document; he said Chile was a lackey of influential foreign circles; and he called Dr. Jan Papanek, UN delegate fired by the new Prague communist regime, a traitor.

Twice Gromyko emphasized that he was acting on direct instructions from the Kremlin. But he did not walk out—as he did two years ago in the Iranian case.

The council voted twice—to put the case on its official agenda and

to give a non-voting seat to Hernan Santa Cruz, delegate of Chile. Both times Gromyko got only the support of the Soviet Ukraine; the other nine members voted solidly against him. Seven affirmative votes were needed to adopt the case for consideration. The veto did not apply.

# Bank Theft Plea Slated

MUSKEGEE, Okla., March 18 (AP)—There was no indication today when Henry Clay Green would plead to charges of robbing the Sweet Home, Ore., bank of \$57,000 last year, but papers permitting a guilty plea were received yesterday from Portland.

Green, resident of Kingsley, Okla., has been in jail here for several months. The plea here will be allowed under rule 20 of the supreme court of the United States which makes it possible for an accused man to do so—with the consent of United States attorneys—at the place where he is in custody, rather than where the offense was committed.

# Canadian Power Imports Eyed

PORTLAND, March 18 (AP)—A Bonneville engineer believes Canadian power could be imported to ease Oregon and Washington shortages until Columbia and Snake river projects are operating.

S. E. Schultz, chief BPA engineer, told the professional engineers of Oregon that the region will "just about get by" with its present generating capacity.

He said Canadian power should be imported until 1953 when planned hydro-electric dams are due to operate.

# 71 Killed In Mine Blast

BELGRADE, Yugoslavia, March 18 (AP)—Dispatches to Belgrade newspapers today estimated at 71 the death toll in Sunday's coal mine explosion at Racha, on the Istrian peninsula.

The dispatches said at least 90 were injured and 10 are missing. Racha is in Yugoslav territory. Previously the Yugoslav news agency Tanjug had said 171 were killed.

Representatives of the ministries of mines and labor left today to investigate. The government ordered 50,000 dinars (\$1000) paid to each family which lost a member, plus 3000 dinars (about \$60) for each surviving child.

(The National Council for Liberation for Istria said at Trieste that 300 died in the blast. The council, an Italian organization, said the disaster was caused by careless

handling of ammunition at the Arsa mines. The territory formerly was Italian.)

(An Associated Press correspondent at Trieste, which is not far from Racha, tried to reach the scene of the blast. He was turned back, although his papers were in order.)
