

Middle East Oil Output To Be Upped

WASHINGTON, March 18 (AP)—Secretary of Defense Forrestal said Wednesday "events in the last several weeks" may force this country to change plans to boost production of Middle Eastern oil.

The defense chief told a senate small business subcommittee he already has asked military experts to say whether it is advisable to continue shipping steel to build pipelines in Saudi Arabia.

"Within the next 48 hours, certainly by the end of the week, I shall have an answer to it," he added.

This answer, he emphasized, will deal only with the broad question of whether it is more desirable to employ a pipeline or tankers to carry oil from Saudi Arabia to the Mediterranean.

And Secretary of Commerce Har-

risman promised the committee headed by Senator Wherry (R-Neb.) that he will not "cut export quotas for the second quarter of this year until Forrestal has completed his study."

At present, Harriman said, the western hemisphere supplies roughly 75 per cent of the petroleum needs of Western Europe and the Middle East about 25 per cent.

Foreign Aid Bill Pushed

WASHINGTON, March 18 (AP)—House republican leaders renewed Wednesday their call for passage of a foreign aid bill by April 1 but left details of the measure to the foreign affairs committee.

Under that time-table, the aid bill would go to a house-senate conference committee in ample time for congress to complete action well before the Italian elections April 18.

Speaker Martin (R-Mass.), chairman of the house policy-making group, said no attempt was made to reach agreement on the amount to be spent for foreign aid or how long the program would run.

The bill passed by the senate calls for \$5,300,000,000 to be spent in the first year of operation.

Republican foreign affairs committee members sat in on the policy-making meeting and then went immediately to a session of the full foreign committee.

Rep. Fulton (R-Pa.) said he will offer a provision directing the ad-

ministrator of foreign relief to "encourage" participating European nations to accept displaced persons to the maximum extent practicable.
