

Religious Teaching In Schools Out

SALEM, March 19 (AP)—Attorney General George Neuner ruled Thursday that religious instruction cannot be given in Oregon schools during school hours.

But he held that such instruction can be given during school hours if it is given off of school property.

In an opinion for Rex Putnam, state superintendent of public instruction, Neuner interpreted the March 8 United States supreme court decision on the subject as meaning that school property cannot be used for religious instruction.

Putnam said he would recommend that school districts follow Neuner's ruling.

Putnam said two plans are being used in Oregon schools to give religious instruction. Both are sponsored by churches during school hours, and parental consent must be given.

The essential difference is that in some cities the instruction is given in the schools, while in others the pupils are taken to churches.

Neuner wrote that use of school property for religious instruction during school hours violates the constitution.

The United States supreme court opinion involved the Champaign, Ill. system where the instruction is given on school premises.

Regarding the plan whereby the pupils are taken to churches for their religious instruction, Neuner said:

"We fail to discover any basis for concluding that such a plan is unconstitutional and it is our opinion that the supreme court decisions do not so declare."

Green Backs Loan Drive

WASHINGTON, March 19 (AP)—AFL President William Green said Thursday the nation must keep its economy strong to "halt the aggressive tide of Soviet expansion and prevent another war."

Addressing the opening rally for the security loan drive, Green said 8,000,000 AFL workers will "back up American foreign policy" by buying bonds with "every dollar we can spare."

The loan drive will open formally on April 15 and run through June 30.

"Now is the time to save," the union chief said.

Holgar J. Johnson, president of the Institute of Life Insurance, New York, also endorsed the bond selling drive. But he added a plea for tax reduction despite the opposition of the treasury, which sponsored the bond drive rally.

Surplus Pipe To Be Sold

SEATTLE, March 19 (AP)—Tons of government surplus four and six inch pipe from the Canol oil project are being moved to various points on the gulf and west coasts. The Alaska Transportation company is handling the job.

The Clive Hitch is handling the biggest single load—5000 tons. The vessel loaded her cargo at Skagway and was reported today off Grays Harbor on her way to Houston, Tex.

The Grommet Reefer, which arrived in Tacoma today, will discharge 400 tons of pipe there and leave almost immediately for Skagway to load another 1200 tons.

Between 10 and 15 thousand tons of the pipe has been purchased by the L. B. Foster company of Pittsburgh.

Rome Rally Fight Flares

ROME, March 19 (AP)—Fighting broke out at a big leftist rally in the middle of Rome today and police riot squads were summoned to restore order.

The battling erupted after a speech by Luigi Longo, Italy's No. 2 communist.

The popular front rally, in Rome's Piazza Santi Apostoli, not far from Piazza Venezia, was one of three political meetings being held almost simultaneously on this holiday—St. Joseph's Day.

One rightist meeting was addressed by Marshal Giovanni Messe, one-time commander of Italian forces in Russia. Another heard Giuseppe Saragat, leader of the anti-communist wing of the socialist party, and Ivan Matteo Lombardo of the socialist unity ticket.

Police quickly quelled the disorders at the leftist rally and no casualties were reported.
