WASHINGTON, March 18 (AP)—The house has voted to pay \$9738 to three Oregonians for injuries they received in accidents involving a government airplane and a mail truck.

It allowed \$7738 to Clarence S. Osika, Coquille. Parts of a naval airplane which crashed into a building at Coquille struck him. The accident occurred in 1944.

The house also approved payment of \$1000 each to Mr. and Mrs. Russell Coulter, Portland. They were hurt when their car was struck by a mail truck in Portland in 1944.
