Winter Hits Oregon Again

Winter lashed Oregon with snow and rain today as if Old Fury himself intended to make himself well remembered with only two days left before the advent of spring.

Snow started falling in Klamath Falls around 9 o'clock this morning and left a coat of several inches on the ground. Snow continued intermittently throughout the morning and at times was driven by a strong wind. Total precipitation up to 10:30 a. m. today was 1.1 inches.

Roads, highways and streets were glass-slick this morning and many cars slid down hills as they carried early morning workers to their jobs. Snowplows and sanding crews were working today in all mountain passes after six inches of fresh snow fell in most of the passes last night, the state highway commission said today.

Chains are required on mountain roads, all of which are covered with packed snow.
