

MARKETS and FINANCIAL WHEAT HOLDS STEADY TODAY

CHICAGO, March 25 (AP)—Wheat managed to hold steady throughout the session on the board of trade today, but feed grains sank under small scale selling.

Wheat at one time was up more than 2 cents in the May delivery. Buying was based on reports of better domestic flour business and rumors the commodity credit corporation had raised its cash wheat buying prices 2 cents a bushel.

Corn and oats tried to move ahead with wheat for a time, but demand was not aggressive. Additional declines in live hogs caused some selling of corn late in the day.

Wheat closed 1 1/2-2 1/4 higher, May \$2.41-\$2.41 1/4, corn was unchanged to 1 cent lower, May \$2.16-\$2.16 1/4, oats were unchanged to 1/4 lower, May \$1.09 1/4-1/2, and soybeans were 3 to 7 cents higher, May \$3.53.

NEW YORK, March 25 (AP)—Leading stocks generally held to the advancing side today for the eighth successive market session.

Gains of fractions to a point or so—there were a few wider jumpers—predominated near the close. Assorted rails, steels, oils and industrials were in front. Minor losses were plentiful.

Touching highs for the year were St. Louis Southwestern Railway preferred, Santa Fe Union Pacific, Western and Chicago corporation.

Ahead most of the time were Southern Pacific, Southern Railway, Northern Pacific, U. S. Steel, Youngtown Sheet, Sears Roebuck, American Smelting, Westinghouse Electric, Johns-Manville, Standard Oil (N. J.), Mission Corp., Gulf Oil and Nickel Plate Railroad.

Oil of Calif. ran up about 8 points on a few transactions.

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US Cows Prove Sissies, But UN Committee Out To Grow Tougher Stock

WASHINGTON, March 25 (AP)—And now, stand by for an item of international importance: The cows of this country are sissies.

No, I'm not kidding. And neither is the food and agriculture organization of the United Nations, which brought the whole thing up.

Before we meander into the international picture, let's consider the classification of cows and other barnyard characters.

U. S. cows—and cows of other agriculturally advanced nations—are highly specialized creatures.

Some do nothing but produce rich milk. Some stand around growing their T-bones.

Same with other beasts and fowls. Our pigs are the pork choppers. Our chickens are the cacklers. Our sheep the sheepishers.

Sounds good, doesn't it? But there's a catch. If these cows, chickens and pigs are to live and prosper, everything must be just so.

Special Care
Most of them need special shelter. Most of them need special food, and lots of it.

I am reminded of an old friend of mine. She was a cow named Jerz—probably because she was not a Guernsey.

Jerz was as finicky as a Junior leaguer.

In the winter we had to warm her drinking water. When Dad wanted to shift her from prairie hay to alfalfa, he had to start a month early, sneaking a little alfalfa amongst the prairie when she wasn't looking.

Jerz was a good cow, but let's face it. Most of the world isn't set up so that a cow can be hay-chosen.

That's where the United Nations' agriculturists come in. They think improved livestock would make this world a better place in which to live.

So they have come out with a book called "Breeding Livestock Adapted to Unfavorable Environments."

They find that years of study have gone into developing livestock for rich farmlands—and only a few minutes of study have been made for the poor countries.

Water Buffaloes
Take the water buffalo. There are 78,000,000 water buffaloes in the world with 48,000,000 of them in India.

The W. B. is a very handy animal. He can pull a load from one to one and a half tons, zipping along at two miles an hour. This may not be a very flash speed, but it's just right for cultivating a rice paddy.

Mrs. Water Buffalo can give up to 3000 pounds of milk a year.

During the three days of sign-up of 1948 farm plans under AAA last week, many farmers did not get sign-up, a longer period of sign-up is scheduled to give them all an opportunity. The county committee has decided to include the week of Monday, March 22, to Friday, March 26, inclusive, for a further sign-up period.

Members of the county committee will be present to assist during this time. Before coming in land owners should definitely have in mind the acreage of different crops to be grown and the farm improvement practices to be carried out during 1948. Practices this year are changed considerably from 1947, being limited in number due to decreased payments this year.
