

Better Land Use Is Aim Of Farmers

Land development and fertility improvement, to a much greater extent than erosion control, are logical lines of effort for Klamath basin farmers. Generally erosion is a minor problem.

Long ages of erosion left this basin a relatively flat and level topography. Erosion, of course, is serious only in hilly areas where the lubricating influence of heavy rainfall helps the force of gravity level terrain. On most farm land here the force of gravity hasn't much opportunity to move soil.

There is practically no Klamath soil going down Klamath river, and very little soil movement not charged for by contractors. Some of Lower Klamath, Tulelake and Malin does occasionally get as far as Klamath Falls by air.

Occasionally, poorly managed waste water fills in drain ditches with soil that would pay better if left in the field. And there are steeper fringe lands which might more profitably be irrigated by sprinkler irrigation or at least ought to have closer attention when flood irrigated or when corrugations are made or potatoes are planted.

Few people worry much about the tonnage of soluble plant nutrients which is leached out of soil in drain water. Any comment on over-irrigation receives little attention. More information concerning such losses is needed.

In this area land leveling, drainage and diking are land development activities for which the major incentive is greatly increased productivity. When dozers, scrapers, carryalls and land planes "erode" a high spot into a low one and permit uniform controlled irrigation, the internal revenue department benefits by an additional amount even though they insist cost of such work must be counted as an investment.

Fertility improvement results from leveling and drainage but once land is leveled and drained, fertility improvement and maintenance is simply a matter of good farming.

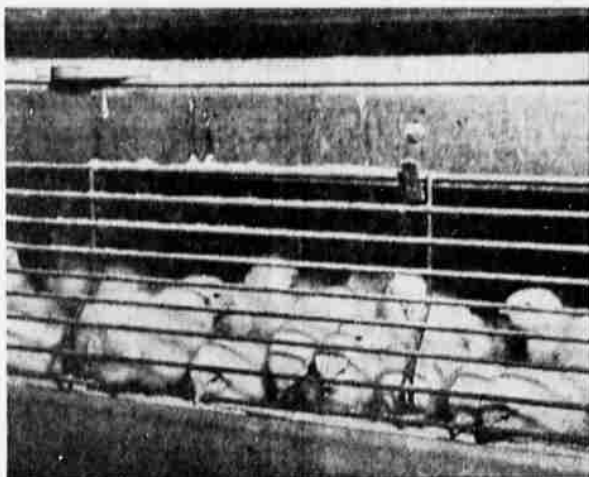
Rotation including legumes, green manure crops and return of crop residues and animal manures are not new ideas. No experienced farmer argues about the soundness of maintaining a reasonable level of organic matter and humus in soils.

A soil low in humus and organic matter tends to run together, become puddled and dry into hard clods. Aeration and water permeability are poor. Bacterial activity is low.

Temperature In Brooders Important

Proper temperatures are essential for chick brooding, especially during the first two weeks, according to N. L. Bennion, extension poultryman at Oregon State College. Before the chicks arrive, Bennion says, the poultryman should test to make sure that a temperature of 92 to 95 degrees can be maintained for a period of 24 hours, about two and one-half inches above the floor, near the edge of the brooder.

Beginning the second week, the temperature may be reduced 5 to 7 degrees each week, until a temperature of 70 degrees is reached. The experienced poultryman can tell by the action of the chicks whether they're too warm or too cold. However, a thermometer should always be used as a guide.

Farmers Cut Poultry Count

WASHINGTON, March 25 (AP)—So you think egg and poultry prices are too high?

Farmers think they aren't high enough. So they're cutting their flocks sharply.

A special agriculture department survey of hatchery operations issued today indicates that 20 per cent fewer chickens will be raised this year than last. The department had suggested a cut of seven per cent.

If the survey is borne out, consumers will feel the full effects in 1949. There will be fewer layers, and hence fewer eggs. Also there will be much less poultry meat.

The department said the high cost of poultry feed is a major reason for the decision to grow fewer chickens.

Pair Here Build Up Fryer Trade

Blau Boran and Russ Faulkner, partners in the Klamath Poultry farm, are raising Indian Rivers and Cornish chickens. Indian Rivers took several prizes throughout the country last year.

Between 800 and 1000 day-old chicks are purchased each week, fed until they are 10 weeks old and sold for fryers.

Baby chicks are kept for three weeks in metal batteries with controlled heat, in rooms equipped with germicidal lights.

These batteries have five levels, each level filled with chicks which are fed on mash for three weeks. Then they are moved to another room and fed until ready for market. The chicken mash consists of corn, meat scraps and soybean.

Boran and Faulkner slaughter poultry only as it is ordered and make two or three deliveries per day. They sell 50 per cent of their crop to night clubs and restaurants drawn and the other 50 per cent to retail groceries not drawn.

The men had 14 years of poultry marketing experience when they bought out Armondo Carrini's chicken business last November.

Spud Stock Set Around 60 Million

Marketable stock of potatoes on hand from the 1947 crop held by growers and distributors as of March 1, 1948, is estimated at 60,920,000 bushels. (This estimate does not include potatoes held in storage by the government.)

March 1 estimate this year is 80 per cent of a year ago when 75,230,000 bushels were held, and is about the same as the holdings on March 1, 1946. Heavy stocks are in Maine, North Dakota and Colorado.

In Oregon, stocks were estimated at 1,950,000 or a decrease of 45 per cent from a year ago. The Oregon stocks on hand have depleted rapidly since January 1 with a total of 2,150,000 bushels moving during the two-month period.

Estimates vary as to potatoes on hand in the Klamath basin but it is generally estimated between 500 and 700 cars of all kinds, as of March 1.
