Indian Office Confirms Sale
 Sale of \$284,200 worth of timber on the Klamath Indian reservation to Ewauna Box company of Klamath Falls was affirmed today by the U. S. Indian service regional office in Portland.
 The timber, some 10 million feet of Ponderosa pine, lies in the Kanoot unit No. 6 on the reservation. Ewauna was high bidder for the logs, \$25 a thousand feet, on March 2.
 However, there had been an attempt on the part of the Ivory Pine company, second high bidder, to have the Klamath tribe set aside the Ewauna bid on grounds that the Kanoot timber was located near present Ivory Pine workings and was needed in that company's operation.
 The tribe voted down the suggestion last week.
