

Kilgore Snares Top City Kegling Honors

Mel Robinson Falters Victory Chance

Shelley Kilgore, who averages about 160 in regular league bowling and was granted a 15-pin handicap in the men's city key tournament, came up on the inside rail—so to speak—and won the class A all-events trophy, top individual honor of the city tourney. Kilgore's score for nine lines was 1893.

He had a score of 447 in team play and last night posted 397 in doubles and 559 in singles for the all-events mark.

Al Hackenworth, who has only a four-pin handicap, took class A singles with 628. His three singles lines were 201-210-205 plus 12 handicap.

The class A doubles race saw some classy shooting by Mel Robinson, who had a chance to grab off singles and all-events honors also, but cooled off in his fifth game of the night.

Robinson posted 650 scratch plus 12 handicap in his part of the doubles, while partner Harvey Pavlat added enough pins to make the Robinson-Pavlat doubles score 1248, some 42 pins better than the nearest competitor.

No change was recorded in class B standings lead, Terry McCormack winning singles and all-events with scores posted Monday night. His all-events total was 1707 and singles 609. McCormack and Maynard Papp took class B doubles with 1144.

Team winners were Laundry Insurance, captained by Ernie MacBeth, 2855 in class A, and Superior Toy Laundry, captained by Estu Kiser, 2811 for class B.

ROBINSON EYED
Last night's gallery at Recreation alleys had its thousand eyes glued on Mel Robinson after his doubles total of 662 was announced. The doubles total included a 247 line.

Opening his singles effort, Blm Robinson slammed out a 238 line and looked to be well on his way toward beating out Kilgore's already posted all-events high. But he faltered badly and managed only a 149 in the second line of singles and 162 in the third.

The result was that he placed third in all-events with 1760, 43 pins back of Kilgore and 19 back of Hackenworth. Ivan Bold barely got in the class A all-events money with 1717.

McCormack's class B all-events total of 1717 was considerably to the good. Second place went to Loren Palmerton with 1653, while Lee Dugan and Merle Smith tied for third at 1650.

Palmerton ran second in class B singles at 591, followed by Mike Morris at 572, Arnold Colahan and Toy Hampton, 568.

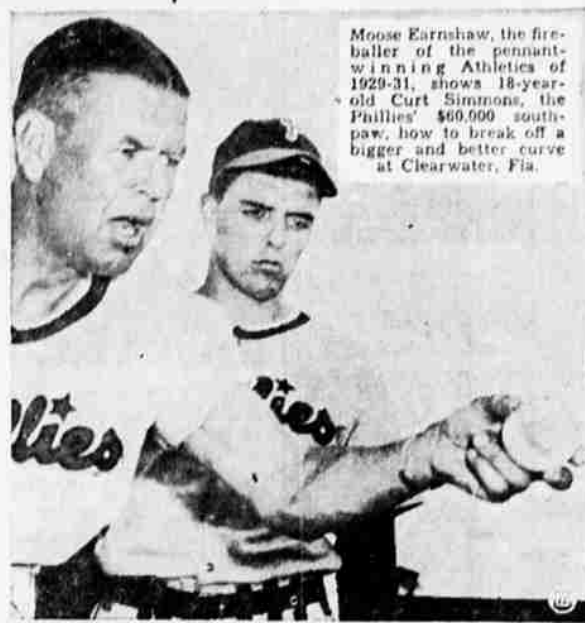
