

### Pomona Glee Club Visit Slated

Presenting its spring concert tour through the Pacific Northwest, Pomona college men's glee club of 33 voices will be heard in a concert on Tuesday, April 6, at the Klamath Union high school auditorium under the sponsorship of the Klamath County Junior chamber of commerce.

The spring concert tour will take the glee club from its home city of Claremont, Calif., as far north as Seattle, Wash.

This year the club is directed by Arthur B. Hitchcock, who succeeds Ralph H. Lyman upon the latter's retirement. A former Pomona student, Hitchcock also studied at Eastman School of Music where he took his master's degree, and in Vienna, Austria, where he specialized in piano. Before going to Pomona college in 1916, he was director of choral organizations, first at Whittier college in California, and later at Brown university.

Soloists with the glee club will include Gene Hartley, tenor; Brian Russell Jr., tenor; Floyd Craig, tenor; Bruce Miles, baritone; Carroll Naborn, baritone; and Leonard McClure, baritone. The Blue and White quartet, composed of Gene Hartley, first tenor; Floyd Craig, second tenor; Doug Hines, baritone, and Craig Hubble, bass, also accompanies the glee club.

### Plywood Setup Held Good

WASHINGTON, April 1 (AP)—The soft plywood industry said today it could meet plywood requirements for the 1948 housing program.

Industry leaders, representing most of the nation's producers, met here with Acting Secretary of Commerce David Bruce and department officials.

The department said 981,000,000 square feet of soft plywood would be required in the 1948 housing program. It was advised that production next year would be more than 1,800,000,000 square feet. The industry promised to do everything possible to produce more housing items and channel them into the housing program.

### Seed Prices Show Drop

Retail prices of eight out of 14 seeds of important conservation crops are lower this year than last, according to the U. S. department of agriculture. Some of these crops, such as white clover, Kentucky bluegrass and common alfalfa, are important in large sections of the country.

Prices of seeds that have gone down, compared with last year, are as follows: white clover, 80.3 cents a pound, down 27 per cent; common alfalfa, \$11.40 per 100 pounds, down 21 per cent; Grimm alfalfa, \$52.40, off 13 per cent; timothy, \$9.71, down 10 per cent; Kentucky bluegrass, 49.4 cents a pound, off 58 per cent; common ryegrass, 13.8 cents a pound, down 6 per cent; orchard grass, \$23.39 a hundred, down 17 per cent; smooth bromegrass, \$23.40, down 21 per cent.

On the other hand, the price of red clover seed at \$68.90 is up 17 per cent; alsike at \$54.60 is only two-tenths of one per cent up; Ladino clover seed at \$2.62 a pound is up 25 per cent; sweet clover at \$20.90 is 9 per cent up; Korean lespedeza at \$15.70 a hundred has jumped 29 per cent; redtop at 27.1 cents a pound is up 3 per cent; crested wheatgrass at \$26.90 a hundred is up 36 per cent; and Sudan grass at \$12.20 is up 3 per cent.


